YOUNG MOTHER CALLED.

Mrs. Nellie Worthen Ek, wife of Alma Ek, and daughter of Bishop and Mrs. C. H. Worthen of the Fourth ward, died at 2:45, after a severe illness dating from May 27. On the above date, she gave birth to a lovely baby girl, who is alive and doing nicely, but Mrs. Ek never fully recovered and has been hovering between life and death at the hospital in Ely. Her mother has been with her for a number of weeks past, and her father reached her bedside just before she passed away.

In the death of Mrs. Nellie Ek and that of Mrs. Nellie Priestley, who died one week ago, the Fourth ward loses two of its most earnest workers. Both were members of the Sunday school board of Pioneer stake and were active in ward affairs. They were close friends, having been inseparable from childhood, until they were married, when Mrs. Ek went to Ely with her husband, his work taking him there.

The remains will reach Salt Lake Monday evening at 8:30, and notice of funeral will be given later.

MRS. BENNION'S FUNERAL.

The funeral services of Mrs. Esther A. Bennion of Vernal, widow of the late John Bennion, were held yesterday at Taylorsville, the old home of the Bennion family. Appreciative remarks were made by Samuel R. Bennion, John C. Sharp, Alice Merrill Horne, Wm. J. Snow of the B. Y. University, Governor Wm. Spry and Joseph E. Taylor, all old friends of the deceased, and all of whom paid high compliment to her ability, integrity and general worthiness.

Mrs. Bennion was born at Wootton Parish, Kent, England, July 7, 1832, and came to Utah in 1854, walking the

entire distance across the plains, and sharing all the hardships and privations of early life in Utah. She was the mother of nine children, six of whom survive her. Her poetical writings have received much favorable notice, having appeared from time to time in various publications and some selections having been printed in the Utah Album of Poets, prepared for the Chicago World's Fair in 1893.
