THE MURRAY INVESTIGATION.

TESTIMONY BEFORE THE SPRINGER COMMITTEE.

REPRESENTATIVE MURRAY'S TESTIMONY.

(CONTINUED.)

In some remarks that I made on the floor of the House last night, I made these quotations from the report of the Committee on Internal Revenue to the Secretary of the Treasury, Nov. 25, 1881. That was my understanding in 1881, and I was trying to stop that report.

By the Chairman: Q. You state that you called attention to these abuses in a speech in the House of Representatives?

A. Yes; these remarks were made by me at the last session of Congress.

Q. And at that time you called attention to these abuses in your capacity as a member of the House?

A. Yes.

Q. The abuses had then been going on for a number of years, had they not?

A. Yes, more or less, before Mr. Wharton's removal from office.

Q. And the abuses had been going on since the removal of Mr. Wharton?

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is almost a self-charged proceeding. Q. Is there anything to show that distance these men were taken? Kentucky is a large State, and a good many of them have come from the north, south of Louisville. A. Yes; a good many of them may have come from the north, south of Louisville. Q. You do not mean to say that they all came from your district? A. I should hope not. I imagine that a very small percentage came from my district. Q. Of course you do not pretend to say that they were all taken long distances? A. No; but I should think that a statement of this kind on its very face would lead an legislative mind to want to know the bottom facts. I refer to it for that only. Q. From the same report: Total amount of fees for self and salaries of assistants: \$9,516 18 G. M. Thomas, 120 94 Total, 9,637 12 I certify the foregoing statement to be correct and true. Witness my hand this 14th day of October, 1881. GEORGE M. THOMAS, United States District Attorney.

Q. What period does that report cover? A. From July 1, 1880, to June 30, 1881. You asked me if there had been any improvements since 1876. It is very hard to find that out, but I believe that the people of the State as law-abiding citizens as compared with other States, I believe the people of Kentucky have submitted, especially the poor people, who have been harassed by the Federal officers and deputies, in a way which I did not believe they could tolerate. Q. You thought it beyond human endurance? A. Yes. Q. Any people to be submitted to such treatment and submit to it peacefully? In the city of Lexington, partly through the impulse of the majority for the powerful majority, I should think that the people of Kentucky, there has been a good deal of political fraud and corruption, and I am not aware that there has been in any other part of the State. There has been some of it in my district. I suppose you allude to that. Q. What I mean is as to whether the people of Kentucky are disposed to obey the laws of the United States? A. I think so. Q. As compared with other parts of the country? A. I think they are as law-abiding in Kentucky as in any other part of the United States. Q. The object of my question was to ascertain if the people of Kentucky were so disposed toward the United States as to make it necessary to your part of the State, as law-abiding citizens as compared with other States, I believe the people of Kentucky have submitted, especially the poor people, who have been harassed by the Federal officers and deputies, in a way which I did not believe they could tolerate. Q. You thought it beyond human endurance? A. Yes. Q. Any people to be submitted to such treatment and submit to it peacefully? 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
