FORMAL OPENING OF NEW HERMITAGE

Manager Wilson Entertains 1,000 Guests at Largest Log Cabin Ever Built.

AFFAIRS OF CITY AND COUNTY.

West Truants Cared for Outside of State School—Burial of "Grandma" Salisbury—Other News.

Ogden, Utah, Aug. 15.—The formal opening or reinauguration of the new Hermitage in Ogden canyon, took place last night, with about 300 people in the log hotel, and as many more on the grounds, including the campers. Though having built the largest log house ever erected, Manager Billy Wilson already regrets that the big building is not larger.

The house and grounds and the tents of the campers were illuminated with electric lights and many Chinese lanterns were also used to decorate the surrounding grounds. Inside the cabin an orchestra dispensed music while the guests dined in the large dining room. \$0 guests were seated at ten tables, all arrangements and waiters who have been adjured incorrigible are committed to the reform school. PREPARING FOR THE DRAWING.

Commissioner Richards and Messrs. Howbert and Dern, the commissioners which will supervise the drawing for Uintah lands, decided yesterday to have the drawing take place at the Provo academy. A platform sufficiently large to accommodate the commission, clerks and a number of prominent citizens will be built at the northeast door. On this will be placed the box, which will contain all the envelopes with identification slips in the several registration offices. This box is eight feet long by 26 inches square and will be large enough to take the numbers necessary for each drawing, it being arranged so that the men can turn it with a crank. Three boys will draw an envelope each simultaneously from apertures in the box; the identification cards will be numbered and registered, and spent envelopes recorded. The clerks will be posted and published on the number when there is no more land. They will be drawn at the rate of about 2,000 a day till that time. After that the drawing will be more rapid. Each person registered will be notified by mail at the address given on the card, of the number he draws. The first 111 numbers will be read to the

IRRIGATION CASE CONCLUDED.

Testimony All In, Arguments Heard, Now Held Under Advisement.

The taking of testimony and making of arguments in the suit brought by the North Ogden Irrigation company against George A. Fuller et al., which has been occupying the attention of Judge Bitchie during the past week, was completed at noon yesterday and taken up again this morning. The case has been hard fought by both parties to the suit, each claiming superior rights to the waters of the North Fork of the Ogden river. The plaintiffs asked for a permanent restraining order against the Eden people to prevent them from interfering with the irrigation, also for \$30,000 damages. Much expert testimony was given in the interest of the Ogden Young university.

SACRED BUMPER, who was the star of the evening, in an informal speech, said that he was heart and soul in favor of developing Ogden again.
