

UNDER THE NEW LAW

County Commissioners will Radistrict the County for Elections.

AUDITOR GETS \$1,000 A YEAR.

Its First Year at \$24,000—Board Organized Under the New County Government Law.

The county commissioners will take a census of the voting population at the several precincts of the county for the purpose of redistricting under a new county government law. This morning the board fixed the value of County Auditor J. M. Fisher at \$1,000 per annum and his term at 25 years.

The Board of Commissioners, A. E. Fader, chairman, met at 10:30 this morning. Moses, Onder, Christensen and Roberts of the board were present, with County Auditor J. M. Fisher and County Attorney W. H. Morris.

George Cradle petitioned for relief from certain tax sales, and his request was granted.

A regulation from the utility regulator's office was granted.

Arthur J. Wiley applied for the position of auditor to the board, and the utility regulator's office agreed to this.

Similar application was made by John C. Johnson, business manager of the Standard Oil Company.

James L. Miller, attorney for the Standard Oil Company, was present.

A resolution was adopted which was that it be the sense of the board that the case of the oil company, the Jordan River lying in the south portion of the county, and the oil companies that have the same, be referred to the board of the Jordan River, as related to a public utility highway, and the road supervisor or Oregon provide for notification to the oil companies to pay taxes on any work on said road.

On motion of the commissioners and by request of the county clerk, the board issued the order recently issued by the commissioning the delivery of certain warrants issued in 1894.

NO NEW OVER PAYMENT.

A resolution was presented by Mr. Morris that H. G. Quinn be authorized and directed to deliver to G. P. Totten all the books and records in possession of acid Quinn pertaining to the title he may have been possessed by him as trustee of the gas and illuminating properties and Union Gas Company. The resolution was adopted.

AUDITOR'S MALLORY FIXED.

The question of salary of the county auditor was brought up in a resolution of H. G. Quinn.

Resolved, That the salary of the county auditor during the year 1896 be the same as heretofore, to wit, \$1,000 per annum, and the same is so ordered.
