ST. DAVID, On the San Pedro, Cochise Co., A.T. May 17th, 1881.

Editor Deseret News:

On the 10th of May, at 5 o'clock p.m., Prest. A. F. McDonald and Elders C. I. Robson, H. W. Brizzee and myself, with Orlando Merrill, left Mesa City for this place, and arrived here on the morning of the 15th inst., via Florence, Tucson, Seinega, Empire City (in the Empire mining district), Sanford's Ranche, Boacomori Mountains, reaching the river at Contention, eight miles up the river from here.

Found Prest. P C. Merrill, of St. David, together with the Saints, in excellent health and spirits, with an addition of several new arrivals from Utah. Since our visit here near one year ago, several frame buildings have been erected, water brought on the site, and a general appearance of health and prosperity. 
