Its further consideration was postponed antil 11:30 Saturday morning. Dibble, of South Carolina, as a question of privilege, called up the Allentown public building and the President's veto message. The report of the committee was read recommending that the bill be passed not-withstanding the veto. The House refused to pass the bill over the veto; yeas Idl, nays 84, not the necessary two-thirds vote in the affirmative. SEC. 8. Any person who shall neglect or refuse to conform to the provisions of this chapter, or to the written requirements of the Inspector of Buildings, consistent there-with, shall be liable for each offease to a fine in any sum not to faced one hundred dollars, or to imprisonment not to exceed thirty days, or both such fine and imprison-ments. ng that the army be paid monthly when over the Secretary of War shall so direct.
