Criminal Business Brought to interesting Point Settled by Judge Anderson.

In the Third District Court this morning District Attorney Varian filed his findings in the Chaffey case, upon which Chief Justice Zane recently gave his opinion. There are four separate "findings" as to the property involved, but they could hardly now, being a review of what was done in the court below, be considered otherwise than as ordinary deliberated.

The attorney of the United States for Mineral City has addressed a communication to us as Chief Justice, which he has filed with the court.
