UTAH MATTERS.-Washington, June 20. Utah District attorney Bates has arrived here to consult with the Attorney General in regard to Utah matters. Mr. Bates is very confident that he will be able to indict the leading Mormons for polygamy under the law of 1862 by a grand jury com-posed almost entirely of Mormons. FATAL SHOOTING AFFRAY.

Shorily after eight o'clock last night Charles L. Dalson was shot and killed by Oliver Obey. Immediately after committing the fatal duel Obey gave himself up and was taken to the city jail and the remains of SADDLE Delaon were conveyed to his own rooms, on Second East Street; admittance there being refused, however, they were subsequently taken to the house of Mr. Claudius . Spencer, where they now lie.
