Suit for \$65,000.

Theodore Burback, agent for Charles W. Heikelthorn, of London, England, has instituted suit in the Third District Court against Simon Bamberger, of this city, to recover \$65,000, with interest thereon, at the rate of 10 per cent. per annum from the first day of January 1882, and the cost of suit. The plaintiff alleges that in 1881, in London, England, he loaned defendant \$20,000, to be used by the Central Pacific Coal and Coke Company (limited) of the denominations of \$100 sterling, and aggregating \$15,000. That said debentures so loaned were to be returned by said defendant to said plaintiff, or his heirs, on the first day of January, 1882, and that defendant promised and agreed to return the same before said date. That the said debentures are of the market cash value of \$20 sterling each, and of the aggregate value of the cash value of \$15,000 of the current money of Great Britain, or \$55,000 of the current money of the United States of America. Plaintiff further alleges that on the 25th day of January, 1882, defendant writing, promised to pay the same; that after the making and signing by the defendant of said promise, he at different dates and times departed from the said Territory and remained out and beyond the same several months after each of said departures, and that defendant has been absent from the Territory more than one year since the 25th day of January, and the time of making and signing the said acknowledgment and new promise. Plaintiff further alleges that the defendant has not returned the said debentures, or either of them, to the plaintiff, and asks for judgment as above set forth.

Arraigned.

Today Soren Jacobsen was arraigned in the Third District Court on the indictment charging him with unlawful cohabitation. He entered a plea of not guilty.

Departures.

Brother J. N. Whitaker, who has been traveling in England the past few weeks gathering up the genealogy of his family, and Mr. Thos. A. Acquitted.

Wm. J. Allen was tried in the Third District Court today for stealing \$70 from Philip Sydney, at Park City, July 28th, 1887. The accused, when arraigned before Police Justice James, pleaded guilty, but on being indicted changed his plea to not guilty. Since the alleged theft, Sydney has disappeared from this part of the country, and the prosecution could not prove that he had ever lost any money, so Allen was adjudged not guilty.

A Medical Publication.

It is announced that, about the first of next month, the first number of a monthly medical journal, to be published in this city, will appear. It will be called the *Salt Lake Sanitarian*, and will be "devoted to the prevention and cure of disease, and the promulgation of the laws of health and life." It will treat this class of subjects in a popular rather than a technical manner, and will be designed for all classes to read. The Doctors Shippl will be the editors, and the terms will be \$2 per annum; single number 20 cents.

Railway Accident.

A terrible accident occurred on the O. R. & N. Railway, at a point near the ranch of Leonard Lowe, about 15 miles from Baker City, on Sunday evening last. It was a freight train of 18 cars loaded with lumber and merchandises. The accident occurred while rounding a curve and going a down grade of 1 1/2 feet to the mile, running at the rate of 12 miles an hour. Seven persons were killed and the track, cause of the accident, an animal on the track. J. A. Graham, brakeman, (umped from his seat and severely injured. George Kaimback, the engineer, was so badly injured that he died in an hour after the accident occurred. Robert McCreary, fireman, had a back broken and was plowed under a car. He also died. A team in the freight car jumped out and saved his life. The train ran over one man to blame. —Idaho Statesman, April 27.

Two Convictions.

Yesterday afternoon Mollie Thompson, alias "Dutch Mollie," was found guilty of grand larceny, in being associated with Charles Wilson in robbing a Chinaman. She was sentenced to one year in the penitentiary. After the trial, Mollie Thompson was closed, Charles B. Gillette was called and tried for stealing a mule belonging to a young man named Snyder. The jury found that he was the guilty man. He received a sentence of one year in the penitentiary, and retired from the court room "swearing a blue streak" for the testimony that convicted him. Several of those called to serve as petit jurors have been excused for the time. Leo Baumgarten one of the grand jury, has also been excused from further service.

Temperance Excursion.

A temperance excursion to the National Prohibition Convention at Indianapolis and to other eastern points will leave the city on the 23d prox., running through to the Missouri river without change of cars. The party is arranged for the purpose of enabling delegates to the convention and their friends to make the trip at a considerable less than the regular first-class rates. The route will be via the Central and Union Pacific. Through the courtesy of C. E. Ingalls of Salt Lake, an invitation has been extended to the party to visit the Mormon place of worship there. The party will be allowed the use of its cars during the day at Salt Lake, no other expenses will be incurred. Each car of the train will have a steward, who will see that no smoking, drinking or other objectionable conduct is indulged in. The time of the trip will be limited to fast express. The managers say they will do all in their power to make this first trans-continental temperance excursion a grand success. —San Francisco Chronicle.

Teachers' Meeting.

Following are the minutes of the Teachers' Institute held today: Meeting called to order by President W. M. Stewart. Opening prayer by Mr. G. M. Mumford. President Stewart said that the special business to be considered this morning is the trip to San Francisco. He read a communication, a copy of which had been sent to all the county superintendents of Utah, explaining rates, conditions of the excursion, etc. He also read from the official bulletin of the National Educational Association, giving much information in detail as to the objects of the coming excursion. The president urged upon the members of the association to take this trip, as the cost will be small and the advantages great. After some further discussion on the subject and a reference to the summer institute, and to the annual examination of teachers, the regular programme was begun. Mr. A. Spencer read an interesting essay on "Memory." Mr. H. Schutt delivered an excellent address on "Advanced Geography." Mr. W. J. Dean opened the subject of "How to make school interesting during the spring months." Dean enumerated the many causes of lethargy that will show itself if special efforts are not made to counteract it. The gentleman himself has got along splendidly this spring, having got his pupils interested in the formation of a school library. The subject of botany may be introduced in a simple way, and prove a valuable help. President Stewart said that the spring months are the best time to cultivate the observation. Territorial Superintendent P. L. Williams spoke upon the coming excursion of teachers, and urged all to go. By this trip much can be seen and heard of great value to all educators, in furnishing new ideas. He was sorry to say that no exhibits from Utah will be seen at the association's rooms. Mr. Williams gave some detailed information on the different routes, rates, attractions, etc.

Body Identified.

An Inquest was held yesterday, at Ogden, over the body of the man found there. He was identified as John Swanson, a former resident of Ogden. He was aged about 32 years, and was a native of Sweden, having resided in this country about twenty years. His wife died about a year ago, since which time he said he has never appeared in a normal condition. He was a very peculiar man in his habits, and hence made but few friends. Last fall he had quite a spell of sickness, and was attended by his neighbors, William J. Love and wife, who were thus far intimate with him. A little while ago he decided to sell his land, with his little home upon it, and gave an option on it of \$200, which expired at the end of next month. The consideration money was to be \$2,500. The place is situated on the southwest corner of Third and East streets, and contains two and a half acres. Since having given the option in question, he appears to have become despondent, and especially brooded over his action in selling his home, apparently regretting having done so. It is supposed that his weak condition, brought about by sickness and his wife's death, led him to seek self-destruction. The coroner's verdict is as follows:

An inquisition held at Ogden City, Ogden Precinct, Weber County, on the 27th day of April, A. D. 1888, before Thomas D. Dee, Justice of the peace and for said precinct, said body, upon the body of John Swanson, then lying dead, by the jurors whose names are hereto subscribed. The said jurors, after their oath duly taken, find that John Swanson came to his death by drowning in Ogden River, between the 10th and 20th days of April, 1888, and that whether the same was accidental or intentional, we have no means of knowing. Sound Literature.

Editor Deseret News: Swift's statement, "A man is never less alone than when he is alone," is especially applicable to a student in a choice library. In books we associate and commune with the good and the learned of all ages. As the influence of the authors we read is as potent in our lives and characters, as is that of our living companions, it is wise we should look with a critical eye into the moral and literary character of our libraries.
