FOUND REELECTORS

Official Inspecting Party Sees Shocking Conditions in Local Plants.

DRASTIC MEASURES PLANNED

City Council Will Probably Hold Special Session to Consider New Ordinance.

Unsanitary conditions were revealed in five out of six local slaughter houses yesterday by a committee of councilmen, three health commissioners and a government inspector, when an official visit was made to ascertain if any stringent regulation was needed. They were horrified at the revolting nature of the fifth and disease which lurked about in these slaughter houses which provide meat for the city. There is no question, according to the members of the party, but what the most stringent regulation must be placed on the killing and dressing of meat. Many of the parties are in favor of calling a special meeting of the council for Friday night to enact into law the proposed ordinance. The ordinance is to be put into effect in 10 days to put their abattoirs in a sanitary condition and under government inspection. Others have expressed their opinion that it would be better to revoke licenses of three or four of the places and not allow them to open again until the plans were satisfactory to the government inspectors.

The party was composed of Councilmen Black, Hall, Boyd, Murdoch, and O'Connell. Dr. M. R. Stewart, city health commissioner, Walter J. Frazzette, food inspector, William Hanson, state food and drug commissioner, and government Inspector Woodfin. They left the Wilson hotel at 10 o'clock yesterday morning in three automobiles and first to the Bingham Packing company in the northern part of the city.

AN IDEAL PLANT. "This is an ideal plant," Mr. Frazier said, "and there is nothing better anywhere in the country. It is under government inspection. We were shown the manner of detecting disease in this plant. There was one beef that was slain which was infected and the inspectors ordered it carried out of the killing room. It was brought in to be killed. If it hadn't been for the inspector the animal would have been shipped in to Salt Lake, no doubt and sold for consumption."

"We then started back to the city and visited the slaughter house and found a mile and a half north of Beck's not far from the city. The condition was much different in this place. The place was unsanitary and some of the buildings were in a state of decay. It was a new plant, here, if not the building of a new plant."

"When we reached the Hopworth Bros' plant at Eighth and Sixth streets, there was a new plant in the neighborhood for registering a complaint. An effort was made to clean up some of the fifth since the government inspectors intended to visit the place. But the unsanitary condition was apparent from the smell. I would not accept as a gift a city block within half a mile of this place. This place will have to be overhauled to make it comply with any kind of decent inspection."

"T. J. Nipper, ice proprietor of the Palace Market, has a slaughter house at Twelfth South and Second West streets. The unsanitary condition of the killing room, the tank room and the yards are something frightful."

A BETTER ESTABLISHMENT. "It was some relief to get to the slaughterhouse of the Murray Meat company's plant at State and Thirtieth South streets. The conditions here were very good. The conditions of the company will be ready for government inspection."

The establishment of Haddon & Williams at Twelfth South and Second West was not in a satisfactory condition by any means. Some cleaning up had been done in advance of the party, but many corners of the place reeked with filth.

Councilman O'Donnell described the condition of one of the smaller slaughterhouses, but he declined to give the name of the proprietors, it was so filthy.

"I have no desire to eat any meat for some time after looking into the killing room and tank room," he said. "I saw there newly slaughtered meat hanging about in a room against filthy walls which carried on their surface the accumulated filth of years. It was an inch thick and was composed of blood, hair and dirt. The stench was disgusting. What I saw of this place is equally true of some of the others."

Four out of the six slaughterhouses will be arranged before the council Friday night to show cause why their permits to conduct abattoirs should not be revoked. The ordinance, which is taken from the one in effect in several of the large cities like Chicago and Kansas City, will be presented Friday night and discussed.

LECTURES ON BINGHAM. Interest in the lectures on mining which are being given under the direction of the Y. M. C.
