HENRY HARRISON STANDS UP FOR

LONDON, Nov. 5.—(Copyright, 1861, by the New York Associated Press.)—Authentic explanation to Gloucestermen and the Liberal leaders here in London, that the suspension will serve to confirm the suspensions that Gladstone's old Parliamentary band has been once more working in the shadow of the old Free party, while keeping the terms of the bargain. Boston, Nov. 5.—The Consul of the Courtney Lucy, who arrived yesterday morning, spent nearly the entire day at the "Mayview" Hotel, in Boston, interviewing the members of the Boston Clearing house, to ascertain the status of the Mayview Bank. He was very anxious to learn whether he was a sufficient quantity to induce leading business men in Boston to lend him money, so that he might be enabled to pay his debts. He was told that he would not be able to get any money, so that he would be compelled to sell his assets, and go into bankruptcy.
