HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, 11.—Harrison

from the committee on foreign

affairs, reported a bill in the

case of the President to enter

into a further convention with

Venezuela in case that govern-

ment should desire a hearing of

the case decided by the com-

mission. The bill was recom-

mended and reported back the

Senate bill for the sale of tim-

berlands in California, Oregon

and Washington territory. It

provides that such land may be

sold to any person at the min-

imum price of \$100 per acre, and

that the proceeds of the sale

shall be used to pay the interest

on the public debt. The bill

was passed.

Mr. Wright of Pennsylvania,

from the same committee, reported

a bill providing for the sale of

public lands under the

homestead law, the act to be in

operation until \$10,000,000 have

been expended in the sale of

land. The bill was reported

without recommendation and

referred to the committee on

the whole.

From the same committee,

reported a bill to restore to the

market certain lands in Utah, Pa-

cific.

Welch, from the same com-

mittee, reported a bill for the

relief of the public lands. Pa-

cific.

Wiggett, from the same com-

mittee, reported a bill providing

that any person who shall plant,

protect and maintain for eight

years, ten acres of timber land,

shall, at the expiration of that

time, be entitled to a patent for

the whole of such quarter section.

Howitt, from the same com-

mittee, reported a bill permit-

ting Nebraska to cede certain ter-

ritories to the State of Missouri.

Paterson, from the same com-

mittee, reported a bill relating

to the sale of public lands. Re-

ferred to the committee on the

whole.

Reagan, from the same com-

mittee, reported a bill to regu-

late interstate transportation by

railroads, and to prohibit unjust

discrimination by common car-

riers.

Boyd made a speech against

the bill, as not being what it pur-

ports to be. The bill was re-

ferred to the committee on the

whole.

Philips reported the bill on the

Wool Market.

Boston, 11.—A fair business has

been done the past week in domes-

tic wool, but at low and unsatisfac-

tory prices. The recent large move-

ment of long fleeces has failed to

impart a firmness to the market.

Ohio and Pennsylvania wools are

shade lower than last week, and

sales of X and Y could not be

forced at over \$1.00 per pound.

Choice wools have, in fact, been

recently sold at \$1.00, indicating a

slight decline of 13 or 14 cents per

pound from prices paid for them in

the interior last July, and the cost

of carrying them since that time.
