Pugilistic and Other Athletic
Events Arranged on
Coast.

JACKIES ARE IN CONDITION.

Meat Weaver Decides to Put on Finals
in Championship Bout at
Los Angeles.

Los Angeles, Cal., April 17.—Next
week will be a busy one in Los An-
geles sporting circles, scores of pug-
ilistic and other athletic events hav-
ing been arranged for the delectation of
Uncle Sam's tars. The big battleships
will anchor off the Los Angeles ports.
San Pedro, Long Beach, Santa Monica,
and Redondo, tomorrow and Sunday.
and will stay here until next Friday.
The interval will be filled to over-
flowing with amusement of every kind and
every sailor of sporting proclivities will
be given the time of his life.

What's more, the Jackies will furnish
a considerable portion of the sport
themselves. For weeks past they have
been held aboard the various ships in
the fleet and in almost every branch
of sport when the Jackies come ashore
they will bring with them their own
candidates for championship honors.

Leut. Weaver has decided to put on
at Los Angeles the finals in the cham-
pionship boxing events of the fleet.
There will be one contest for each day
of the program here, each deciding a
class championship of the fleet. The
lightweights will fight the first day,
the volleys will be the second day, the
middleweights the third and the heavy-
weights the last day.

Tremendous interest attaches among
the men of the fleet in these contests.
The Los Angeles entertainment com-
mittee has proffered a prize of \$50 each
for the winner of each of the events.

The announcement that the big pug-
ilistic events will be refereed by Cham-
pion James J. Jeffries has aroused the
keenest interest among the sailors. The
heavyweight champion of the fleet now
at Los Angeles, who won the belt last year
and has successfully defended it half
a dozen times. However, there are at
least two other aspirants for the hon-
ors.

Semi-finals will be finished before
the ships arrive at Los Angeles ports,
so that all will be in readiness for the
big events.
