One State Officer Advises Another on a Tax Remittance Question.

Attorney General Hilditch today sent the following opinion to State Auditor Richards in answer to a request for legal information:

I have your favor of March 17th, in relation to the following question: "In the light of Sec. 2, Art. II of the Constitution, is it the duty of the State Auditor to audit the accounts of the State Treasurer?"

The question involved turns wholly on the construction of the following language found in Sec. 2 of the Revised Statutes of Utah of 1896: "The auditor shall audit the accounts of the State Treasurer, and shall report to the Governor the result of his audit."
