Gen. White Still Thinking of Blood

HE IS AS DETERMINED AS EVER.

His Commissioners are to be Sealed
Whatever May be the Decision
of the Court.

DENVER, March 20.—The first regular Colorado National Guards arrived from Upple Creek last night and will be kept under orders. It is ready for immediate service until the point hereabouts is settled. An opinion in the case submitted by Governor Weller to the supreme court was expected before Friday. Unless the court gives a direct answer to the governor's question of whether Orr and Martin or Morris and Barnes are entitled to the same in the event which will be decided by your opinion the matter may be left to others, and will again take steps to seat his select committee.

Judge Paul Rogers, the government's principal counsel, said to-night: "I am not interfering or associating myself with the governor in calling out the state troops. The court has no right to advise the executive in regard to trials, and we have a privilege to do so. I am not asked for an opinion on the subject."

Unless the court decides fairly that Orr and Martin are rightful commissioners, Governor Weller proposes to put Morris and Barnes in their places, as it would be necessary to satisfy the entire force of militia and all the able-bodied population in the state. Captain Isaac of the police force says he expects a removal of the commissioners, and a withdrawal of the militia from the capital. A strong guard is to remain at the city hall tonight, and will remain until the present trouble is ended.

Governor Weller will file in the district attorney's office a certificate certifying that he is responsible for the organization of the new force, and requesting that he be included in the contempt proceedings for violation of the injunction.

The Industrial Army.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., March 20.—The news of the Custer army estimate that 1,000 men will be in line when the next to Washington is made on Saturday next. Reports from Canada, Europe and America indicate the strikes are to the effect that the troops are on the march to Milwaukee.

Saturday and Sunday will be big days in Milwaukee. Exercising trains will roll from every point, and it is expected that 6,000 strike-breakers, many of whom will not doubt join the army at the start of its march, will be there.

Last night Casey received a telegram from A. P. York, his agent, saying that 1,000 men were about to leave that city to join the army.
