But these will be subjects of consideration when the stock-herd itself is in successful operation.

It will be seen from the above that the Salt Lake County Co-operative Stock-Herd is now organized, its agents are ready to receive Stock, and everything is prepared to make it a live institution when the shareholders bring forward their animals. When there is a sufficiont quantity of stock delivered into the hands of the Superintendents, then steps will be taken to organize the company under the Incorporation Act passed by the last Legislative Assembly. in the same manner as "Zion's Co-operative Mercantile Institution" is or ganized.

The Social Evil.

Sr. Louis.-The committee appoint-ed by the Board of Health to examine into the working of the social evil law, reports the following facts bearing on the moral and sanitary effects of the law: The whole number of prostitutes registered, when the law went into op-eration, was 718; registered now, 480, showing a decrease of 238. The number of houses of ill fame when the law went inteoperation was 119; the number now is 70. The number of prostitutes ecreased since the time the law went into operation, 58; the number now, 18. 229 women have since been registered, making a total number in the city of 946, which makes the actual decrease in houses of ill fame has much decreased under the new system, from the fact that visitors to these houses come under the notice of officers of the law. The report also states that the number of cases of venereal diseases treated in
