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CITY COUNCIL MEETING.

The North Bench Water Question Settled Last Night.

RE-ARRANGEMENT OF COMMITTEES.

Judges Appointed for the Coming School Trustee Election—Street Paving Proposition.

The City Council met in regular session last evening, Mayor Smith presiding. The following members responded to roll call: Pickard, Spafford, Karkick, Heath, Pittman, Hyde, Hart, Tuddenham, Young, Anderson, Lynn, Parsons, Pendleton, and James.

After the reading and approval of the minutes of the previous meeting, the following petitions were read: The Salt Lake Brewing Company asked for a rebate on liquor tax.

C. P. Fisher asked for a rebate on real estate license. Committee on streets.

W. D. Haring et al. asked that the water rights around the Cunningham farm be lowered from six to four feet in height. Committee on streets.

Sullivan & Louie, salmon-canisters, asked that the municipal portion of the liquor license be reduced to five percent of the retail price.

John E. Butler asked that the grade for sidewalks on the north side of Second North street from Fifth East street to a distance of 100 feet west be changed. Committee on streets.

Monte & Griffin asked for an appropriation of funds for street sprinkling. Committee on streets.

G. D. Ames et al. represented that the slaughter house near the Utah Lake Mill and Elevator company's ground northwest of the Water Springs was a nuisance and asked that it be closed, sanitary and quarantine committee.

Joseph A. McKee asked that the time for laying the sidewalks on West Third North street be deferred. Committee on streets.

Harris asked to be allowed to lay a cement sidewalk instead of asphalt. Committee on streets.

W. W. Watson asked that the Great Salt Lake & Utah Springs railway company, in constructing its grade on Main street, be allowed to use the city's water for the purpose of testing the water.

The board of public works reported the following abstract of work for laying sidewalks on Third North street, all of which greatly exceeded the estimate, before session.

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
