

# TELEGRAPHIC. A FORGER'S METHODS

Religious Exercises a Cover for Criminal Operations.

SEVERAL BANKS SWINDLED.

The Career Abruptly Ended by the Arrest of the Fellow with Many Alias.

VERMONT, N. J., Aug. 2.—The arrest of August Baker, with a dozen aliases of South Vermont, on a charge of forgery, is an important case and will probably put a stop to his operations for a while. The prisoner's full name is Robert E. Hawley. Since he is the eighth person to have served a term of imprisonment in the Burlington state prison, after which he went to Montana and from there to Topeka, where under the name of Robert Hale Alexander, he claimed to be engaged by the publishing house of Rand, McNally & Co., of Chicago. Here he conspired himself with the editor of Good Templars, T. M. C. A. and other religious organizations and set up a party to get him off. He also incited the members of a very responsible family. His criminal operations extended over several Western states, notably Montana and Colorado. In 1888 he was arrested for forgery at Washington, D. C., and sentenced to three years' imprisonment. After his release he continued his criminal career, committing forgery in Chicago, Cleveland and several other cities. He prepared for his final departure by entering into correspondence with some number of officers of some religious organizations in the city whose names are proposed to events. He then took up the residence of a widow with a child, well known in the town of the order of time. Temporarily under the cover of this disreputable appearance of widowhood, he prepared at religious meetings and parades to bring him into contact with officials from whom he could obtain influence him to the bank he proposed to rob. He then prepared a signal and for a short time kept robbing a bank account and finally selected a target at which he would not be disturbed. They said he had been in the country for two years and was wanted by the police throughout the United States.
