The Civil Rights Bill.

The Civil Rights bill, as it passed the Senate, reads as follows-

That all citizens and other persons within the jurisdiction of the United States shall be entitled to the full and equal enjoyment of the accommodations, advantages, facilities and privileges of inns, common schools and public institusupported in whole or in part by general taxation, and of cemeteries so supported, and also of institutions known as agricultural colleges endowed by the United States, limitations established by law, and applicable alike to the citizens of any previous condition of servitude.

SEC. 2. That any person who four shall violate the foregoing section to its benefits, except for reasons by law applicable to citizens of every race and color, and regardless of any previous condition of servitude, the full enjoyment of any accom- ia Leather, with ornamental lettermodations, advantages, facilities or ed, or inciting such denial, shall, for ed thereby, to be recovered in an action on the case, with full costs; and ble to make them over six quires. shall also for every such offense be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than one thousand dollars, or shall be imprisoned fice, and orders received for size of not more than one year; provided, that the party aggrieved shall not recover more than one penalty, and when the offense is a refusal of burial, the penalty may be recovered by the heirs at law of the person whose body has been refused burial; and, provided further, that all persons may elect to sue for the penal- to them. ty aforesaid, or to proceed under their rights at common law and State statutes, and having elected to proceed, in the one mode or the other, their right to proceed in other jurisdiction shall be barred; but this proviso shall not apply to criminal proceedings, either under this act or the criminal law of any

State. SEC. 3. That the District and Circuit Courts of the United States shall have, exclusive of the courts of the several States, cognizance WANTED!-100,000 Pounds of all crimes and offenses against and violations of the provisions of this act, and actions for penalty given by the preceding section may be prosecuted in the Territorial, Price will be paid in CLOTH and District, or Circuit Courts of the United States, wherever the defendant may be found, without regard to the other party, and district attorneys, marshals, and deputy marshals of the United States and commissioners appointed by the Circuit and Territorial Courts of the United States, with powers of arresting and imprisoning and bailing offenders against the laws of the United States, are hereby specially authorized and required to institute proceedings against every person who shall violate the provisions of this act, and cause him to be arrested and imprisoned or bailed, as the case may be, for trial before such Court of the United States or Territorial Court by law as has cognizance of the offense, except in respect of right of action accruing to the person aggrieved, and such District Attorneys shall cause such LIENIS proceedings to be prosecuted to their termination, as in other cases, provided that nothing contained in this section shall be construed to deny or defeat any right of civil action accruing to any person by reason of this act or otherwise. SEc. 4. That no citizen, provid-




