The programme of ceremonies, which was read by Edgar Mills, Esq., was as follows:—1st, The dedicatory prayer, by the Rev. Dr. J. Todd, of Pittsfield, Mass., of which the following is a report:

"Our Father and God, and our father's God, God of creation and God of Providence, Thou hast created the heavens and the earth, the valleys and the hills; Thou art also the God of all mercies and blessings.
