reached here last night and this morning, accompanied by committee, all fears of suffering from starvation have disappeared. The amount of grain destroyed in the elevators is estimated at two and a half million of bushels, while four and a half million of bushels stand in the four large elevators belonging to Munck & Scott. The immense Illinois Central elevator, and the old Iowa elevator, are saved. The contents of the vaults and safes of the various express companies are reported in the safest condition.

It is believed that the foreign and San Francisco insurance companies will pay their losses; some eastern companies have given notice of their intention to pay.

The three immense pumping engines of the water works are badly injured, but the boilers are unharmed, and the superintendent expects to have the best engine working in a week.

The number of people rendered homeless is put at 25,000-35,000, or all but 5,000 of the entire population on the north side, 30,000 on the south, and 5,000 on the west side.


