Jury Awards Another Neclected Passeng r the Sum of \$1,250.

Following the precedent established by the jury in a similar case in Judge Ritchie's court recently, a jury In Judge Lewis' court yesterday aftericon returned a verdict for \$1.250 in favor of plaintiff in the case of J. A. McCollum against the Southern Pacific company. The action was brought to recover \$1,999 as damages for being compelled to ride from San Francisco to Ogden in a second class coach which was poorly heated and ventilated and contained no drinking water and was occupied from Reno to Ogden by number of drunken men who insulted plaintiff and used vile and abusive lan-guage and were guilty of obscene and indecent conduct. The jury in the case of T. M. Matthis

against the Southern Pacific company which was tried several days ago b which was tried several days ago in Judge Ritchie's court, rendered a ver-dict in favor of plaintiff for \$1,000. The third case of the same character and arising from the same facts is on trial today in Judge Lewis' court. The plaintiff is Agnes W. Fitzgerald and she asks judgment in the sum of \$1,999.
