The Council Will Appropriates \$100 a Month for its Maintenance.

TO EXAMINE WEEKLY PATROLS.

CITY LAND LEASED TO THE UTAH FROZEN BRICK & TILE COMPANY FOR TWENTY-FIVE YEARS—OTHER MATTERS.

At least there are several of the municipal legislators who are following in the wake of their president and little elsewise from the fourth precinct by slipping into the council chamber at a late hour, often long after the transactioons of business has commenced. It was three quarters of an hour after regular time last night when a chairman could be elicited to wind the gavel for the night. President Loomis again being absent.

The convention present were Rich, Pritchard, Curtis, Hardy, Bell, Kelly, Evans, Wanless. The last named gentleman finally succeeded in taking the chair and the work of the evening was commenced.

The following committee came in later: Horn, Stomach, Moran, Lowman.

Another twenty minutes was lost in settling the order of business to be pursued at the meeting.

THE PROCEEDINGS.

The report of the committee on public grounds in reference to the lease by the city of certain park lands to the Utica Company and its subsidiary, the Utica Power Company, was read. The Utica Power director escaped come up and stated the power might expire over an attempt to take the rental fee from \$100 per year back to a period of fifty years, he denied back to the committee no further report.

ASPHALTUM AND STONE BLOCKS.

The committee on streets reported recommendations of a number of citizens that asphaltum be required to be used to construct a smooth and even surface for paving with asphaltum and stone blocks on State street between First and Eighth streets, and on State street between First and Second streets, First West to First West, First West to Second South, Second South street, Dom First West to Dom West. Adopted.

WATERPIPE EXTENSION.

In the matter of the petition of J. H. Durst to extend watermaines from premises now owned by Wm. C. Evans up 1st Street east to North Temple, and thence west to First West Street, that the city engineer is granted and the owner of the maines is directed to extend the same to a distance of one thousand feet from the east end of Evans.

EXAMINER PROPOSED.

The committee on finance reported recommending that the members of the tax collector committee be requested to examine the weekly page 16 of the respective departments and approve them if considered correct, and that the treasurer be instructed to forward a copy of any examination of financial documents to the auditor of accounts at least two members of the committee.

MORE LIGHTS.

On recommendation of the committee on improvements and electric light was ordered placed at the intersections of Sixth, Sixth and Eleventh East Streets.

LIQUOR LICENSES REMOVED.

Removals of liquor licenses were granted to Henry Kegley, Carney & Merritt, Fred Hobbs and H. C. Koch.

FOUR FALLEN WOMEN.

The committee on police reported as follows in the matter of the petition of the twelve fallen women:

We recommend that \$100 per month be appropriated for said house on the following conditions: That unmarried girls and women who have been married and who are now widows, shall have admission and treatment therefor that said house be under the jurisdiction of the health department, and that the house shall present a written report to the Committee of each month concerning the receipts, disbursements, kind and number of inmates and general business of the home.

WILL HONOR GARSHONIERS.

The petition of C. D. Durst et al., asking that an ordinance be passed compelling the city engineer to honor applications for permits for the use of land by city employees, was taken up and granted, and the city attorney was instructed to draw up the necessary ordinance.

STILL PLEASANT SOCIETY.

On the recommendation of the committee on police the application of

Dick L. Davis as policeman was voted down.

A COMMITTEE'S SILENCE.

The committee on police recommended that the report of Police Justice Goye on the matter of the Utica Company's application for a license to sell beer be overruled, that those who presented it be given a hearing, the character of offense tried for and why dismissed without further penalty.

11 MORE VOTES.

The committee on public grounds received the annual report of the Union Fire Department, which referred to the fact that the fund had increased to the company for twenty-five years past the million dollar mark.

The committee recommended that the fund be released for necessary repairs to the building, and that the company shall erect a new building on the site of the old, and that the new articles be sold or given away, and that the amount of \$10,000, which six months ago was sold, be given away again in advances of \$100 for five years thereafter, and that the company pay \$250 per year for the next five years and \$500 for the remainder of the life of the house, a sum of \$600 to be given for a funeral performance of conditions. Adopted.

WARM SPRINGS LEASE.

Regarding the petition of Barnes & Barnes' lessee of the Warm Springs, the committee on public grounds reported that they had no objection to the proposed extension of lease for a term of twenty-five years.
