Transitory Herds. Be it enacted by the Governor and Logislative Assembly of the Terri-tory of Utah: That where bands of horses or mules, or both, and herds of cattle or sheep, are wintered in of cattle or sheep, are wintered in one county, and taken into another one county, and taken into another county to summer, the taxes on such stock shall be assessable and collect-able in either county, and the County Court of the County where such

assessment and collection may have leather. been made, shall cause to be remit-ted to the County Treasurer of such other county one-half of the county taxes so collected, after deducting therefrom the percentage allowed in such county for assessing and collect-
