KIESEL'S HANDSOME GIFT TO SCHOOLS

Elicits Thanks of City Solons—
Bamberger Bond Accepted
by Council.

AFFAIRS OF WEBER COUNTY.

Ogden Canyon Auto Line—Trades and
Labor Assemblies Object to In-
dustrial School Print Shop.

Ogden, June 16.—At the session of the city council last evening a resolution introduced by Councilman Dickson of the Fifth Ward and extending a vote of thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Fred J. Kiesel for their handsome gift of a lot for a new high school was unanimously passed. The gift was accepted on behalf of the city and a copy of the resolution and the action of the council engrossed and sent to the donors.

The bond of President Simon Bamberger for the State of Utah, in the sum of \$10,000 for a guarantee of the fulfillment of the franchise in relation to the using of Healey avenue for a track over which the interurban road will use steam for a year was accepted and ordered filed.

A bill of \$31 from the sanitary department caused considerable debate and argument on account of the fact that the sanitary inspector had failed to itemize it. It was finally allowed.

A number of petitions from residents on Twenty-second street protesting against the curbing and guttering of that street were received and referred to the street and sidewalk committees and the city engineer.

The council adjourned to meet Wednesday night when the franchise of the Stephens Investment company for the privilege of constructing a pipe line in the south part of the city will be considered.

WILL IMPROVE CO. ROADWAYS.

Commissioners Aid Movement for Construction of State Boulevard.

Ogden, June 16.—At the session of the board of city commissioners yesterday it was unanimously decided to repair the county road in the Roy district that leads from the County Infirmary to the State road, on the east. This road which is one of the most traveled roads in the southwestern part of the county is in the heart of the sand ridge district and has been improved for automobiles on account of the heavy sand.

Since the inauguration of the movement by Weber, Davis and Salt Lake counties for the building of a state road between Ogden and Salt Lake the local commissioners have been rendering all the aid possible in the movement. The present action is the preliminary step of the Weber county board toward the building of the state boulevard.

The commissioners deferred the opening of the bids for the sprinkling of the canyon road for one week, which would allow a number of other contractors to submit bids. This action was taken as it was thought that on account of the recent rains the road would stand for another week without sprinkling.

OGDEN CANYON AUTO LINE.

Articles of incorporation of the Ogden Canyon Automobile Line will be filed with the county clerk within the next few days and which expects to begin business June 25. The capital stock of the company will be \$15,000. Those interested in the proposed company are M. S. Brown, Albert Scroveroff, Jos. Decker, Wm. Van Allen and others.

The company has purchased two large sight seeing automobiles with a capacity of 20 passengers each which will be put on between the mouth of the canyon and the resorts in the canyon. Stop-overs will be allowed the purchasers of the round-trip tickets which the company will put in sale at the mouth of the canyon.

TRADES AND LABOR ASSEMBLY.

Ogden, June 16.—That the action taken by the doctors of the city, recently in ordering their Independent telephones out of their offices will be rescinded there seems to be no doubt. This action is the result of the movement inaugurated by the Trades and Labor Assembly which has taken the matter up at its general meetings.

In relation to the awarding of a contract of printing to the State Industrial school by the committee from the forest service in this city, the assembly voted to employ an attorney to work in conjunction with a committee which was given full power to act. The assembly which is also working with a committee from the state see if a state institution that is supported by the tax payers can enter the commercial world and compete with regular establishments.
