DEATH OF COL. LOGAN.

G. A. R. Veteran Answers Final Master at Age of 83.

Col. Henry Logan, a well known local G. A. R. veteran, died yesterday afternoon at his residence 76 S street, at the age of 83, from disabilities incident to old age. The deceased came to this city 10 years ago from Buena Vista, Col., for his health, and had resided here ever since. He was a native of Preston, Lancashire, Eng., and had been in the United States, he was colonel of the Sixty-fourth Illinois Infantry during the Civil war, practising law at its close, first in Kansas and then in Colorado. He leaves a second wife and two sons, W. B. Logan of Glenwood Springs, and one living in Buena Vista, both of whom will attend the funeral. Col. Logan was a member of the James B. McKeen G. A. R. post.

Will Celebrate Discovery—The Knights of Columbus will give a dance tomorrow evening, in the Jennings block for members and their ladies, in commemoration of the landing of Columbus, Friday, Oct. 12, 1492, on the island of Guanahani, Bahama Islands.

Excursion to Ogden—There will be a teachers' excursion Saturday over the Rio Grande to Ogden Canyon on the trail leading this day at 9:15 a.m. and leaving Ogden on the return at 7:50 p.m. Wagons will carry the excursionists from the mouth of the canyon to the Hermitage.

Work Nearly Completed—Contractor Moran says that within a week, the entire work of macadamizing Second avenue will be completed. The regrading of Tenth East street from Second South to Fifth South streets is well under way, previous to macadamizing, and in 10 days H street from First avenue to Brigham street will be completed.

Awaiting Lower Prices—Local architects are regretting the high price of labor and building material, and say that there will be comparatively little building done this winter on that account. There is a general disposition to wait until prices are lower. An immense amount of construction has been shelved here the past season because it involved such great expense.

Bert Bradfield Committed—"Bert" Bradfield, a lad 12 years of age, who has been before the juvenile court several times, and that the court officers have at times almost given up hope that he will ever reform, was picked up on the streets last night and sent to Ogden to become an inmate at the State Industrial school. "Bert" has made countless promises to the court to do better, but every one of them has been broken.

Fiftieth Anniversary—Dr. H. S. Perkins, the eminent American musical composer and director, recently celebrated the fiftieth anniversary of his advent into Chicago. The White City then had but 60,000 people, a mere handful compared to present extent millions. Dr. Perkins has been making many important musical matters from Maine to California. John P. Meakin of this city graduated from Dr. Perkins' school more than 20 years ago.

Ogden Forest Reserves—Gov. Cutler has received notice from the department of agriculture that of the 27 counties in Utah, there are forest reserves in 25 of them. Davis and Weber are the only two counties without reserves. During the year forest reserves have been established in Box Elder, Millard, San Juan, Grand and Morgan counties. The state receives from the general government 10 per cent of the money received as rents from persons leasing the reserves or other proceeds according to the government.
