Made No Allusion to the Fact That He Was in the Insurgents' Country.

EUROPEAN BANK NOTES.

Paid Special Attention to Importance Of Commercial Paper in Europe's Banking System.

Des Moines, In., Nev. 11,-Senator Netson W. Ahlrich of Rhode Island, chairman of the national monetary commission, consumed his series of western addresses on finance here tonight in a speech before the Bankers'

Mr. Aldrich spoke especially of the growing importance of the west as alfording the next reason why people of Iowa should demand a stacle banking

Senator Aldrich gave more attention than heretofore to the importance of commercial paper in the banking sys-tems of Europe. In discussing dus fea-ture of foreign banking, Mr. Aldrich said:

"In Germany all notes, faxed or untaxed, must be covered by an amount of specie equal to ene-third of the total issue, and an amount of bankable bills equal to the other two-thirds.

Those bills are what we would call commercial paper. They must bear the name of two solvent parties, and must not run for more than 90 days to answer the standard fixed for hankable bills. In France they have a provision that bankable bills there must bear three manes, and must have the same that bankable bills there must bear three manners, and must have the same limit as to time as the German bills. In Great British the custom is to require two names of English citizens, one of whom must be acceptor. Or course, you are aware of the difference in terminology of our commercial paper and theirs. Our people use promissory notes, either with a single name or with indorsers. No such thing as a promissory note is known in the ordinary experience of those countries. A given form of obligation, with morigage and sometimes with collateral, is perhaps the closest approximation to our form of promissory note.

for any misunderstanding whatever," he said. "It is not the purpose of the commission—it certainly is not my purpose—to try to make any part of the American people believe that any of these systems could be adopted in the United States; certainly not without important modifications.

"The habits of the people, the relations between the depositors, the 25,000 independent institutions in the United States, all related to the development of various communities, must be considered; and no system can be adopted in this country that does not recognise that the continuous existence of banks and the prosperity of their business must be maintained.

"If we have any credit organization at all, we propose that it shall be the servant and not the master of existing banks. Any institution or organization that we may adopt must be on that can be fitted into the existing system; and any changes at all radial in their nature—and I am inclined to think that in some respects we shall have to make some changes that will be existing and sudiced in their charges. have to make some charges that will be scientific and radical in their char acter—must be made with a view e adjusting them to our existing system.

Chicago, Nov. 11.—Employes of the Chicago 'Ruilway company must be polite to passangers and seek to cultivate the good will of patrons of the lines.

In a letter addressed to all motor and conductors the company yester-day haid down a new code of rules. If a passenger offers a conductor a trans-fer that is useless and swears because it is refused, the conductor must smile aweetly and give the passenger detailed wasons for not according the site. reasons for not accepting the slip.

### STATISTICS OF INJURIES TO N. Y. RAILWAY EMPLOYES

New York, Nov. 12.—In 21 months, 7,714 of the 63,300 employes of the rall-roads in New York city were injured, according to the report made by the secretary of the public service commission to the commission on employers' liability. This would nean that ou an employer will be injured. lability. This would mean that on an average each employe will be injured once in every eight years of service.

Former Mayor Seth Lowe declared that \$25,000,000 was paid annually in the United States by employers for individual insurance. Of this sum 20 per cent went to brokers: 20 per cent for maintaining offices; 20 per cent for the expenses of the litigation between the companies and the claimanta; 20 per companies and the claimants: 20 per cent to the latter's counsel, and 20 per cent to the persons injured.

#### DRAMA CENSORSHIP REPORT MADE PUBLIC

London. Nov. 12.—The report of the joint committee on the censorship of the drama was made public restorday. The committee favors the retention of the present censorship administration, but recommends that it should be legal to perform an unlicensed play, leaving it to the public prosecutor to indict the producers and authors of indecent plays.

The effect of the adoption of the recommendations of the report will be to give much greater freedom in the production of dramas of advanced ideas, and to permit plays dealing with religious subjects which hitherto have heep forbidden.
