character; that the coupons being cashed by an employee of the city, rendered the city liable for the loss.

The grand jury recommended a thorough examination of the comptroller's office by a committee of city citizens; they also recommended that hereafter payments of city coupons be made by some responsible bank as a protection to the city against further fraud; that laws should be immediately passed prohibiting any issue of city indebtedness other than in a registered form. They recommend the conversion of all outstanding coupon bonds into registered bonds. The jury also believe the system of bookkeeping in the comptroller's office should be changed and improved.

Members of the Board of Trade are beginning to get exasperated over the existing state of affairs. "It may be a long time before we come down gradually. Here we are prostrated for want of prompt telegraphic communication, and are told the company will soon be on its feet again. We don't want it soon, we want it now. We can't afford to wait for months, or for weeks, or even days; and unless some sort of settlement is made promptly, there is going to be a mighty big kick, and don't you forget it."

Six more operators came in from the New York strikers today, making 28 in all here, and over 100 have returned since the strike in this division. The groves in Hillman and elsewhere are full of strikers. Withdrawals from our forces in any direction are false, as are all sensational reports daily circulated through the channels of the strikers.

The strikers are being reinstated. "We took back two more of the strikers today," said a Western official. "They came back and asked for places, and were immediately reinstated. We shall continue doing this as long as we require no more of our strikers. The strikers will be promptly refused. You see, the young people who came to us at the commencement of the strike were only engaged for two or three days. As these have all been left, there will be no more vacancies."

FOREIGN.

BRITISH RELIGION.

LONDON, 3.—The trial of 10 Jews at Nyirgyhaza, Hungary, charged with murdering a Catholic priest, a Christian girl, in the synagogue of Tysa Eszlar, in order to procure her blood to mix in the Passover bread, has been concluded. A verdict of guilty has been returned.

Orders are issued to thoroughly detach troops of men arriving at British posts from Egypt. Sir Charles Dike, president of the Local Government Board, in presenting in the House of Commons yesterday the Government bill providing for the centralization of hospital management in the event of an outbreak of cholera in London, said the general health of the country is very satisfactory, although there was a large mortality in London from diarrhoea. Unusual precautions he said would be necessary to guard against cholera until the expiration of six weeks, when it is believed the danger will have passed.

A dispatch from Paris says it is rumored that plots to restore the monarchy have been discovered. Newspapers in France that profess to give details of the plot say 25,000 muskets for a popular rising are ordered and an attempt was made to tamper with the army. They also state three of the conspirators are arrested.

A box of dynamite, to which a lighted fuse was attached, was discovered in a large linen factory at Cupar, Fife, Scotland. The fuse was exploded, and it is believed the explosive. The attempt made to blow up the factory is attributed to Fenianism. Great excitement is caused by the affair, and police are searching for the person who placed the box where it was found.

The Standard says it has reason to believe De Lesseps has expressed readiness to reopen negotiations with England in regard to the Suez Canal Scheme, and that he is disposed to agree to more liberal terms than he was formerly.
