Negro Lynched After Huntsville, Ala., Jail Was Fired. Huntsville, Ala, Sept. 7.-After setting fire to the jail and smoking out the prisoner while the fire department

was held at bay with guns, and the sheriff, his deputies and the soldiers outwitted, a mob estimated at over 2,000 persons tonight lynched Horace Maples, a negro accused of murdering John Waldrop.
