THE EMEUTE AT SAN QUENTIN.—The San Francisco Bulletin, in referring to the late outbreak of State Prison convicts, says:

According to the report of the clerk of the prison, the first symptom of the rebellion showed itself at about two o'clock on Saturday afternoon, April 21. Fifty-seven convicts had been turned loose in the yard about twelve o'clock, to assist in loading a vessel with brick. The work went regularly along until a few minutes to two o'clock, when one of the sentinels discovered four men scaling the southern wall.
