## SIX GOVERNORS

## ALL ATTEND.

Unprecedented Interest in Coming  
Irrigation Congress—Entertain-  
ment of Delegates.

## SETTING OF CRIMINAL CASES.

City and County Teachers' Certificates  
—Goes to London for Bride

The indications are that the dele-  
gates and visitors at the Irrigation  
Congress assemblage will be much  
greater than have been anticipated. Several  
of the states in the west have  
written that they will have from 20  
to 30 delegates in attendance.

That great interest is being taken  
in the congress by prominent individuals  
is very evident from the fact that  
six governors of states have already  
sent positive acceptances to the board  
of control of the Irrigation congress  
stating that they will be on hand for  
the meeting. The official acceptance  
of Governor Pardon reached Mr. Kiesel  
tonight. The California executive  
states that he had at first declined  
owing to a press of business, but  
on mature thought, however, I  
have concluded that the importance  
of this meeting to the Pacific coast is  
sufficiently great to call for my presence  
there.

The other governors who will attend  
are Sparks of Nevada, Morrison of  
Idaho, Peabody of Colorado, Chatter-  
ton of Wyoming, Wells of Utah. There  
are several other executives yet to be  
heard from.

Col. F. H. Holmes of Salt Lake City,  
to whom was first given the position  
of president of the Eleventh National  
Irrigation Congress, has resigned  
on account of urgent private business,  
has written the following letter dated  
Aug. 22, 1903, Copenhagen, Denmark:

## CORNER STONE LAID

Of Fifth Ward Meetinghouse—Former  
Provo Boy Probably Murdered.

Provo, Utah, Sept. 4.—A large  
number of the members of the Fifth  
ward were present at the laying of the  
cornerstone of the new meetinghouse  
yesterday. Bishop Moroni Snow con-  
ducted the services. The stone was laid  
by Mrs. Oliver B. Bean, president of the  
Relief society and sealed by Mrs.  
Beaman Knight, counselor to Mrs.  
Bean.

The following articles were placed in  
the stone: Copy of the Bible, the Book  
of Mormon, the Doctrine and Covenants,  
and the Pearl of Great Price, a  
record of the word and a copy of the  
Declaration of Independence of 1776,  
and the name and age of Mrs. Chris-  
tina C. Jeppesen, born in Denmark,  
April 16, 1807, who was the oldest per-  
son present at the ceremony and also  
placed the stone after singing the  
opening prayer was offered by Presi-  
dent Joseph B. Keller. The dedicatory  
prayer was offered by President David  
K. H. Remond, who was assisted by  
Bishop Snow, Elders E. S. Hinckley, W. E.  
Bassett and President Holbrook. Ben-  
ediction was pronounced by Patriarch  
Jesse B. Martin.
