ST. DAVID. Cochise Co., Arizona, May 18, 1883.

Editor Deseret News:

President C. Layton, Elders Martineau, Hill and Kimball returned from Pima (Pima), on the Gila (formerly Smithville) Tuesday last, where they held two days' meeting, organized three new settlements, Curtis, Graham and Thatcher. Many new farms are being opened up. Some 44 miles of canal constructed carrying 12,052 cubic inches of water, at a cost of \$30,000.

Sunday and day schools are well represented. Pima has 182 scholars and Curtis a fair number. Relief Societies, Mutual and Primary Associations in working order. In my judgment an excellent location for any who desire to emigrate to a new land. And some energetic men might make himself useful in organizing a musical band either string, martial or both, which would add greatly to the life and joy of the people.

Messrs. Teeple and Frank Fuller have a foundation in, 52 x 28, to enclose flowing mills. The former gentleman also runs a joint stock mercantile house, and Mr. Weach superintends the co op. Pima with the enterprising young men at the head should be the central and head settlement on the Gila, but possibly surpassed by Thatcher six miles above and near the old site of Safford, formerly county seat, but recently removed to Solomonville six or eight miles further up the river.

St. David is coming out. Pres. C. Layton has erected a commodious frame building finished in good style. Elder M. H. Merrill has a new adobe house, Calvin Bingham, Thos. Jones and others are gathering material preparatory to constructing comfortable houses. The west field of 600 or 800 acres of land, fenced and partially under cultivation, will be some renewal towards living.

Our plans are about ready to fence the north field of 2,350 acres of choice land. Our canals, two in number, when completed, will cover 7,000 acres of land which is very new, all filed on, and held for the purpose of dividing into small farms of 40 acres each. Lands here are all government and school, no railroad being allowed but right of way. This gives ample opportunity for many who wish to join us and be sure of getting land at a low rate, for unless many come some who have filed for want of cash to prove up and pay the government will lose their filings. Several of the brethren who live above on a Mexican claim have good farms under cultivation and will without much trouble obtain titles from the grant owners.

Our day school has an average attendance of 70 or 80 scholars, taught by Sister Zette Pomeroy and Miss Alfred Oluff. Sunday School was represented and superintended by Elders Joseph N. Curtis, and M. H. Merrill, and Sisters Rhoda Merrill and Jos. McRae counselors. Young Mens Mutual by T. S. Merrill. Young Ladies by Sarah D. Curtis and Primary by Sister Ester Merrill.
