# REALTY DEAL CLOSED.

### Lichtenstein Becomes Owner of Deere **Property on Market Street.**

The new realty deal mentioned yes-terday in the "News" as about to be closed by Mr, Lichtenstein, was comclosed by Mr. Lichtenstein, was com-pleted last evening, when the deeds were signed, and it was announced that he had become possessed of the Charles Deere property on Market street immediately west of the Federal building, 100 ft. front, and 132 ft. deep, the price paid being \$55,000. This makes the value of Mr. Lichtenstein's down town purchases approximate \$200,000. It is proposed to erect a business struc-ture there of considerable size. As he owns 99x165 ft. to the south of this latest buy. Mr. Lichtenstein now holds a large slice of land right through the block. block

Another deal was started last even-ing, when M. S. Browning, H. H. Ro-lapp and David Eccles of Ogden took an option on the W. H. Dickson property, 40 rods wide and running east and west through the block bounded by Second and Third West, and Sec-ond and Fourth South streets. The property is held at \$50,000, and the option expires Jan. 2.
