NEW YORK, 11.—All insurance companies have bulletined statements of their losses and standing, of which the sum is as follows: Hartford, loss less than a million, assets \$5,250,000; Relief, New York, loss 56,000, capital unimpaired; Williamsburg City, loss 50,000, assets 359,000; Resolute, loss 10,000, assets 100,000; Columbia, loss 75,000, assets 440,000; Star, loss 150,000, assets 40,000; Mechanic, loss 5,000, assets 100,000; Commercial, loss 5,000, assets 100,000; Atlantic, loss 2,032,191; Adriatic, loss 7,500, assets 80,000; Niagara, loss 300,000, assets 1,000,000; Liverpool and London, loss 1,000,000; Phoenix, loss 500,000; American Central, St. Louis, loss 150,000; Farmer's Mutual, York, Pa., loss 5,000; Pennsylvania Underwriters, loss 15,000; American, London, loss 100,000; Pennsylvania, loss 300,000, assets 120,000; Globe, loss 18,000; Orient, loss 150,000; National, loss 10,000; Chicago, loss 10,000; Tradesman's, loss 200,000, assets 450,000; St. Nicholas, loss 15,000; National, loss 120,000, assets 675,000; Lorient, loss 10,000.

Another telegram to the Secretary from New York this morning, says the panic is abated and the writer suggests that there is no need for the Secretary to do anything financially.

The stocks are panicky. All mining prices are five and ten percent lower. Suspensions are reported from V. White, Falout, Parry and Co.; R. Wilcox, and R. J. Kimball and Co., whose account of stocks has been sold out under the rule. The market is now panicky and the worst seems to be over.

The Bostonians have very generally left for home. Hotels are full of them to-day. CHICAGO, 11.—A meeting of citizens this afternoon voted \$100,000 for the relief of the Boston sufferers, and appointed a committee, headed by John Laird Collier, to convey the same to Boston. They leave this evening with the cash.
