LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

**THROUGH BY DAYLIGHT.**—Was repeated last night to a good audience at the Theatre, and its brilliant and sensational scenes were received with great satisfaction by the spectators. It will be repeated to night. Go and see Graham, Harris and Miss Adams, they keep up the pace.

**POLICE COURT.**—This morning Charles Smith, (owner of the Revere House in this city,) pleaded guilty to keeping a house of prostitution, and was fined one hundred dollars each, which was promptly paid.

**ON TRAIL.**—The latest news respecting the case of the Utah Central Bulletin, is as follows: On Friday, 7 a.m.—Central Pacific arrested on time this morning.

**ALTA, Utah, 9.**—Two teams met yesterday on the road leading to the Emma, and the two teams quarrelled as to which should give the road; the quarrel terminated in some blows, neither seriously hurt. They are to appear before Judge Brander this evening for examination. The three men, spoken of in our last, were safe from danger but entirely surrounded by an immense quantity of snow, which prevented them from getting out. For three days they were almost out of food. They returned to Alta on Thursday. The weather quite mild, the sun shining brightly. Snow shoes are becoming fashionable.

**THE CO-OPERATIVE CASHMERE GOAT HERD.**—We had a visit this morning from Messrs. J. E. & B. F. Johnson, Esqs., of the former of St. George, Washington Co., the latter of Spring Lake Villa, Utah Co. These gentlemen are engaged in promoting the interests of the Co-operative Cashmere Goat Herd, their visit to this city being made in connection with that of Hon. John Taylor, of this city, is President of the Company. Hon. Erasmus Snow, of St. George, Vice-President, J. E. Johnson, Secretary, and Walter E. Johnson, Treasurer. This project is now fairly inaugurated and promises to be a very profitable one. All but six or eight of the shares are disposed of. The Capital Stock of the Company is \$6,000, shares \$50 each. The Company has been incorporated in accordance with the Territorial statute. The number of animals of the Cashmere breed they now own is 108, and they are about seventy miles south of this city, on the way to Southern Utah. The product of this variety of animal is expected to be four times greater than that of the common goat, and the quality of the wool, both as to numbers and value. The Company have a herd of common goats with which to cross and grade the Cashmere. Several will be sent to the public sale, and the intention and management of Mr. B. F. Johnson.

**MEETINGS IN THE TABERNACLE.**—Tomorrow at eleven a.m. and two p.m.

**ARRIVED.**—Passengers detained by the blockade on the U. P. R. R., arrived in this city last night, nine days from Omaha.

**NOT INTERESTED.**—In an article in yesterday's NEWS, headed "The Social Evil," it was stated that the parties who gave bail for the prostitution and immoral conduct in Justice (Clifton's) Court, were principally Israelites. A correspondent, a member of that portion of our community, writes, complaining that the statement is untrue, and in making it the NEWS reflected dishonorably upon all the members of that community in this city. In reply, we will say that the report, as it appeared, was as we understood the facts, and it is inserted without the least intention of design of casting any slur or reflection at all discreditably upon the Israelites generally of Utah. It is well known that some of the most substantial and respectable merchants and other business men of this city are of Jewish extraction, and their character and conduct, during a residence of many years here, have been above reproach, and who have proved themselves in every respect good and worthy citizens. In making the statement complained of, we had no more intention of casting a slur upon the character of that portion of our community than we had upon the characters of any other respectable citizens by announcing the arrest of the disreputable persons for whom the bail was given.

**THE COLLEGE LECTURE LAST NIGHT.**—The first of a course of lectures, to be given weekly, during the winter, under the direction of the College Lecture Association, was delivered in Morgan's College last night, by Elder James Brown. His subject, "A Mission to the Islands of the Pacific," was handled in a masterly manner, and was fruitful in information pertaining to the manners and customs of the natives, their peculiar form of welcome to the Missionary, their method of preparing feasts, their fashions, etc. The speaker was listened to with attention and with pleasure by a large audience. The next of the course will be delivered on the evening of Friday, 13th instant.

**RECOMMENDED.**—A large number of the Utah Herald says,

"Mr. Vincent, agent for the Nathan Juvenile Troupe, left for Salt Lake this morning on business for the Troupe. We take pleasure in saying to our brethren of the press, that we have found the agent, and the troupe, very prompt in business matters."

**IN ADVANCE OF THE FACTS.**—Says the Sacramento Union of a recent date—  
"Brigham Young has forfeited his bonds on the indictment for polygamy, and stands now indicted for murder. His trip south will therefore in all probability be continued into Mexico, where the prophet may possibly set up his standard anew, and call upon the faithful of Utah to rally once again. The President's message admits of no hope that the evil of polygamy will be tolerated anywhere in the territory of the United States. If Brigham could manage to transfer his entire establishment, Mormon Legion and all, into Guatemala or Central America, he might (or some of his successors) manage to set up a sovereign republic of his own, with the 'twin relics' as its corner-stone."

Our contemporary has a few inaccuracies in the above, and is rather fast withal. We know of no judicial decision that Pres. Young has "forfeited his bonds." We have not heard of any "indictment for polygamy" against him. Won't the Union "wait a little longer" for the much talked of "Mormon" exodus to Central America or some other far foreign country? So far as we are aware, the exodus has not yet commenced, and there is ample room in the United States for the "Mormons" for a century at least. Take things coolly, friend Union, and don't be in a hurry.

DECLARATORY STATEMENT.

SALT LAKE CITY, December 9th, 1871.  
Editor Deseret News:—Notwithstanding all that has been said in regard to the necessity of filing declaratory statements of ownership of land in this city, a misunderstanding still seems to prevail. Several persons seem to think that because they have bought their land of certain individuals it is the duty of such individuals to file the statements required. The fact of the matter is, that the deeds heretofore made, only transfer the title then held by the party selling, and do not promise to warrant and defend against any person, especially not against the Government of the United States. The privilege and duty of filing statements devolves upon the individuals who now claim the land; not upon those who have sold their claim to it. In future, we will here quote what the act in relation to the matter, says in section 3, "such statement shall be made and delivered by the owner of the land, and the duty of conveying or recovering such land, or any interest or estate therein, in any part, parcel or share thereof, in any court of law or equity."
