LIMA, via Galveston, 16 .- A dispatch from Puente-Pledras announces the death of General Lorenzo Yglesias, brother of President Yglesias and commander of the expeditionary force, while on his return invalided to the city, Colonel Rebayez has taken tem-porary command of the forces. Fur-ther details of the fighting at Cajamarco say the battle lasted several hours and was desperately contested. The Monteneros, who were in large numbers, completely surrounded the city but were repulsed by the government troops, who captured large quantities of arms and ammunition.
