## NEWS OF THE WEST.

A Miners Brings a Man's Leg Off,  
Killing Him.

CHICAGO BOYS DIE FROM PLUNGS  
Falls on Flying Wires—Two Boys  
on Ropes—Booster Heavily  
Scared to Death.

The John Hancock Building, Chi-  
cago, was destroyed Monday morn-  
ing. The building, 45 stories high, was  
one of the tallest in the world.

Mr. John French, 31, had just  
arrived from a long vacation in  
Europe. He was very ill and  
had been unable to get a room  
in the hotel where he was staying.  
He lay down on a sofa in the lobby  
of the hotel, and died suddenly.

DRUGS, AMARAS, OREGON. It is no
