OBITUARY.

Joseph Bean, son of George and Mary Milner Bean, was born on the 18th of April 1814, at Ulskeoff near Tadcaster, in the County of York, England.

He was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on the 5th of February, 1843, in Bradford, Yorkshire, England, by Edward Milnes. The last few years of his residence in Bradford he presided over the Bradford and Idle branches of the Church with ability and faithfulness.

Early impressed with the spirit of the gathering, he, with his small family, sailed from Friesland in February, 1855, in the ship Siddons, landing at Philadelphia on the 20th of April following. From there he continued his journey towards Salt Lake as far as his means permitted, stopping at Cincinnati, Ohio.

At Cincinnati, on the 24 of February, 1857, he was ordained a High Priest under the hands of Apostles P. P. Pratt and George A. Smith, and set apart to preside over the Cincinnati branch of the Church. In April, 1850, he left Cincinnati for Salt Lake City, at which place he arrived on the 18th of September following, after a long and toilsome journey across the plains with ox teams in the company of Captain Edward Stevenson.

He settled in the 11th Ward of this city, where he resided until his death. During his residence in the 11th Ward a part of the time he acted as Counselor to Bishop Alexander McRae, in which position he gave entire satisfaction.

He has gone from our midst. Sons and daughters will miss his kind and fatherly counsel; numerous friends will miss his encouraging words, but with it all there is the unmeasured satisfaction in the contemplation of his long and useful life, noble example and unwavering fidelity to the last. The battle was heroically fought, his victory unquestioned, and those who knew him best are assured he has gone to meet his loved ones who have preceded him, and to reap the glorious reward of his faithful labors in the cause of the great Latter-day Work. May we who are left have power to emulate his manifold virtues.
