The first who spoke [8½] st_ted he hated the "Mormons" and leved to hate them. Mr. M. spoke in his usual uncouth, vulgar, coarse, abusive style. Mr. Bishop, of Pioche, was called for a speech, and after considerable urging on the part of the "Liberals," stated that he was not here on political matters, but to defend John D. Lee. It rather astonished him to see the hate and malice in the breasts of the "Liberals" towards the "Mormon" people. Mr. B. declined to make a speech. Mr. C. made a few remarks, rather temperate. One Swift, a young lawyer from Georgia, who is practising here, showed his hand; he must have felt uncomfortable when the "Liberals" sang "John Brown's Body." "One Spicer" made his little speech, and wound up by saying, that "if we are outvoted we will have to acknowledge, like Lazarus of old, that we were licked by the dogs."

In Beaver precinct 274 votes were polled for the People's ticket, and twenty-three for the "Liberal" ticket.
