

## SAN PEDRO TO OPEN DIVISION

Up-to-Date Track of 38 Miles to  
Ontario is Ready.

IN OPERATION ON MARCH 1.

Some New Features in Equipment  
Not Hitherto Connected With  
Local Trains in the West.

A circular letter that has been issued from the office of E. W. Gillett, general passenger agent of the San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake railroad to the general freight and passenger agents of the various railroad systems throughout the country, announces the completion of the Los Angeles division of the Clark road between Los Angeles and Ontario and notifies them of the inauguration of the freight and passenger service between Los Angeles, Pomona and Ontario, which will go into effect March 1. The division consists of 38 miles of perfect roadbed of decomposed granite protected by the most modern devices and laid with 75-pound steel. The bridges are built of concrete and steel, while the equipment is Pullman's best, being wide vestibuled, lighted with incandescent gas and heated with steam.

One feature of the new equipment especially built to order is the palace reclining chair cars and the parlor cars, which are said to be the handsomest on the Pacific coast. Large luxurious movable chairs occupy the observation seats, upholstered in olive green plush are placed before the large windows. Roomy dressing compartments and accessories not encountered on any local service in the west are also features.

The stations on the Los Angeles division with the distance from Los Angeles are as follows: Hobart, 2; Newmarket, 3; Pico, 10; Haddon, 15; Haddon, 20; Walnut, 24; Pomona, 22; and Ontario, 38 miles.

TWENTY STORIES HIGH.

New York Central to Erect Huge  
Terminal Building.

New York, Feb. 4.—Plans of a 20 story structure covering the entire site of the present Grand Central Station, which will be a masterpiece of modern architecture, are being considered by the board of estimates, at which improvements of the road's terminals in this city were considered. The proposed new building will comprise a large hotel, department store and offices, besides the regular station and underground connections with the subway.

NAME CHANGED.  
Station on Short Line Named After  
The Late Miss Thatcher.

General Superintendent E. C. Calvin this morning issued a circular which sets forth the change in the name of the station, located at mile post 109 between Ogden and McCammon, will be changed to that of Virginia.

The reason for the change is that merchants at Thatcher have experienced considerable trouble owing to their goods being consigned to Thatcher station, instead of the nearest point, Oxford. The consequence has been that the Short Line has been compelled frequently to haul the goods back to Oxford as they could be delivered there. As the station was named after the late Hon. Geo. W. Thatcher and it became imperative to change the name, that of Virginia, the eldest daughter of Mr. Thatcher and the late sister-in-law of Assistant General Passenger Agent D. S. Spencer, is to be substituted.

CONSTRUCTION IN IDAHO.

A Number of New Projects for Ad-  
ditional Railroad Facilities.

The Northwest Magazine is responsible for the following:  
Idaho needs more railroad track. This is the positive conviction of trunk lines and investors in general who are at the back of important projects. The work in one stage or another has been stated briefly as follows: The Idaho Northern is building from Emmett to Garden Valley, 13 miles. The Northern Pacific has been authorized to build from Stites to Grangeville; Col. de Sac to Nes Peres Prairie and Ripon to Lewiston. The Oregon Railway & Navigation company proposes to build 100 miles of track from Lewiston to timber lands in the northwest part of the state. The Oregon Short Line has under survey lines from Mackay north to Salmon City, 150 miles; and from Mackay west to Thunder Mountain, 100 miles. The Pacific & Northern is completing work from Council to Seven Devils, 40 miles. The Boise Basin Railway is to build 20 miles of track. The Idaho Midland has partially surveyed 300 miles from Boise City to Butte, Mont. The Moscow Eastern has surveyed from Moscow east to Potlatch river, a distance of 40 miles. All these railway projects make a splendid showing for the young state and will promote her rapid development.

E. P. TRAMMEN ARRESTED.

Are Charged with Theft of Goods  
While in Transit.

Cheyenne, Wyo., Feb. 2.—Nine Union Pacific trainmen, who ran between Sidney, Neb., and Cheyenne, Wyo., are under arrest here charged with the theft of goods in transit. It is alleged that during the past two months several thousand dollars' worth of property has been stolen from freight trains and checked in this city. A thousand dollars' worth of stolen goods, it is said, has been recovered. More arrests are expected.

SIXTY SURGEONS.

New York Central Employs Small  
Army of Doctors for Emergency.

New York, Feb. 2.—The New York Central railroad has perfected a plan to minimize loss of life and injuries in accidents by employing a small army of doctors who will live all along the line, so that they may be reached at once. Each physician will have charge of a

section. The station masters will be kept posted as to the whereabouts of the physicians so that they may be reached by wire at any time. These surgeons will also respond to calls where passengers are taken ill, and to attend to any emergency. Every train will carry a full kit of surgeon's tools.

Santa Fe's New Hotel.

Bids are to be asked in a few days by the Santa Fe for the construction of a new hotel on the bank of the Grand Canyon of the Colorado, in Arizona. The building is to cost not less than \$75,000, and will be built about 400 feet from the canyon brink at the head of Bright Angel trail. Work will begin on the new hotel April 1, and will be completed by Dec. 1.

EDUCATION OF FEELINGS.

Dr. Tanner Speaks Before Students  
of the Latter-day Saints' University.
