

THE "LORD CANNING."

SHE ARRIVED AFTER A LONG AND DANGEROUS VOYAGE.

DELAYED BY STORMS AND CALMS.

THE UNDERWRITERS HAD GIVEN HER UP FOR LOST—THE CAPTAIN'S STORY.

The British ship "Lord Canning," fifty days overtime, sailed into the harbor yesterday and anchored in the stream.

"The 'Lord Canning' sailed from Newcastle, N. S., W. on January 23rd in command of Captain Thomas Stevenson. Her cargo consisted of 124 tons of coal consigned to J. J. Morris, coal dealer, Salt Lake City, after the "Lord Canning" sailed the British ship "Forest Hall" also left Newcastle for San Francisco and arrived here on April 10th last, severely fire-damaged.

No news having reached news of the "Lord Canning" considerable anxiety regarding her safety was felt by commercial circles. Yesterday when the vessel was sighted in the harbor after a trip of 125 days, there was a general feeling of pleasure.

Captain Thomas Stevenson went direct to the Merchants' Exchange, where he made a long report of his trip.

"We sailed on January 23d from Newcastle," said the captain, "during the first part of the trip we experienced a series of gales and calms, until close to the Three Kings, north of New Zealand. We were then out sixteen days. Calms and light winds continued until we reached longitude 48° E. and latitude 30° S. Then began. Then we experienced very dirty weather; the sky had a wicked look to it and the seas were remarkably heavy."

"In latitude 30° south, longitude 124° west, we were driven eastward to the north, with heavy cross seas. The deck was swerved with water. We were evidently on the outer edge of a cyclone which lasted with great violence for three days, commencing January 10th, 11th and 12th. After the last date the weather moderated and a fresh and strong breeze blew between north-northwest and east.

"On January 13th, south, longitude 123° drove us westward, driving us to a horizon which commenced at east-northwest, toward lake endowment and blew with terrific force. The temperature was 50° F. and the wind 30 m.p.h. through February 23rd and 24th. Afterward the windless ground from east-southeast to west-southwest by north. A fearful sea was running all the time. I attempted to count all points of the compass. The ship was completely engulfed. The main hatch was in the water for hours and the lee side of the ship was submerged and out of sight.

"On January 25th the hurricane was but the lower basal. Skyights were broken in and the water rolled into the cabin, filling it. The decks were covered with water and the hatch was burst open and two large pigs washed overboard, as well as two sheep and a number of fowls. But was washed out of our hold and deck. The ship was listing. We lost nearly all our paint and lumber through the bursting of the oil tanks.

"We kept a continuous supply of oil to keep the ship from sinking. This kept the ship to smooth the sea. It is my opinion that the precaution kept us from getting smashed up altogether. The oil had a wonderful effect on the breaking waves. The ship was listing so much that it was not of the ordinary kind, being a cross sea and rolling to and fro, keeping the ship covered with water all the time. The same weather continued until the 27th and 28th of February and we set about getting things straightened out on board ship, but with poor success, the master permitting but little work.

"The weather however was unfavorable, blowing from the northeast and very moderate and light. When out sixty-three days we passed Pitcairn Island. Master and crew were extremely fatigued and weak. The weather of the time although calm occurred with a frequency that was not approached. Heavy rainstorms now occurred with much thunder and lightning. Land and landward winds and calms continued to keep us back. However, we sighted the Farallones yesterday morning and took a pilot. As the wind was favorable we were able to directly in sight of the faraway coast."

Notwithstanding her long and hard voyage the "Lord Canning" showed but few signs of her hard battle with the elements.

The ship was a well-known marine-accident and marine insurance company said of the "Lord Canning": "She is at the bottom." Another, and as it happens the principal agent of that ship, could not allay the apprehension of the master and believed the vessel would put in an appearance soon, but went so far as to accept a reinsurance for his company's account, so as to pay off his policy. It was known that there had been a calamity in the south seas which had delayed other vessels, and so there was at first but little anxiety for her safety.

There was however one or two difficulties which marine underwriters did not fail to note. One of these was the arrival late of the "Forest Hall" which left Newcastle on the "Lord Canning's" arrival, and delayed for some time this ship. The other news which caused uneasiness was to the effect that a teak steering-wheel had been sprung and the rudder bent. The steersman who off the Pitcairn islands, and as the "Lord Canning" had had fittings his suspicion that she had met with disaster was strengthened.
