ST. PETERSBURG, 3.—It is understood that at the beginning of the Russian New Year, the state police department will be withdrawn from the control of the minister of the interior and placed under the special direction of General Scherevine. A more vigorous administration is looked for.

DUBLIN, 3.—A correspondent reviewing the events of 1881 in Ireland says: The year closed in confusion, contention and war of races and classes; commercial credit is broken, the spirit of the country is sunk in deep depression. The scare produced by the large importations of American cattle has abated. The result of the year's trade shows a decrease of 30 per cent. in the imports. The Irish cattle trade, however, has improved, and farmers in this branch feel encouraged.

Six thousand persons are present at the landlords' meeting to-day, which is the most influential ever held. Earl Donoghue, Marquis of Hadsfort, King Harmin and all the principal representatives of the landed interests are in attendance.

Edme Alexis Alfred de Hodency, French painter, is dead.

J. F. Burgess, ex-President of the Transvaal Republic, is dead.

Congressman Edward J. Morris died to-day at Philadelphia.

The Hudson River is frozen solid from Hudson north to Albany.

The Boston Memorial Association will build a \$10,000 Garfield monument.

The old Vanderbilt homestead on Staten Island, N. Y., burned yesterday morning.

The republican assembly caucus nominated Alvord for Speaker at Albany, N. Y.

Eastern freight rates are said to be 8½ cents over some lines lower than before the war.

A billiard expert made 1,141 consecutive caroms, in a practice game on New Year's Eve in Paris.

The Boston Merchants' Association has voted to apply for membership to the National Board of Trade.

The Boston wool market is firm, with a steady demand. Full prices continue to be realized on all kinds of sales.

Captain Briggs and crew of the steamer sunk by the steamer Newport are all supposed to be drowned.

A Worcester dispatch says: Geo. P. Kendrick & Co's livery stable burned, together with 24 horses and contents.

The London Standard says there is no longer reason for hope that an Anglo-French commercial treaty can be arranged.

It is understood Bradlaugh will appear before the bar of the House of Commons and claim to have the oath administered to him.

A Galveston News Greenville special says: The west side of the public square burned last night. Loss, \$50,000, insurance \$35,000.

It is understood that John C. New, of Indiana, who for several years was United States Treasurer, will be nominated for Minister to Russia.

The President, Secretaries Folger and Frelinghuysen and Postmaster-General James left for Washington. Senators Cameron and Allison are on the same train.

A Detroit dispatch says: This morning a barn belonging to the Centre House, Imlay City, burned and with it Blair's livery stable, in which were 12 head of horses.

Senator David Davis is ill, the result of a cold contracted at the President's New Year's reception. Physicians advise him to remain indoors for several days.

Gen. Hazen, in his postoffice report, notes that not one obscene book has been received at the dead letter office the past year, and to find an indecent photograph is a rare occurrence.

Only routine business was considered at the Cabinet meeting to-day. The President accepted the resignation of J. Stanley Brown, private secretary to President Garfield.

One of the special prosecutors for the government in the Star route cases, stated yesterday that they would commence their work before the grand jury in about two weeks.

A special from Minden, Louisiana, says at a plantation near here, Robt. Lewis, brother of Will S. Lewis, shot Mrs. Will S. Lewis and her sister, Mrs. Thompson, both seriously, and then shot himself.

Gen. Sherman has issued an order stating that the abuse of sick leaves, on surgeon's certificates, has grown to be so great, that it becomes necessary to invite the special attention of the officers making the certificates.

A London dispatch says: A committee consisting of Benjant Silon, Baron Nathaniel Rothschild and Messrs. Cope and Worth is collecting information regarding the persecution of the Jews in Russia and Poland.

Emperor William received congratulations from the Czar on the advent of the new year, and on the seventy-fifth anniversary of his entrance into the army. The officers of the army celebrated the anniversary in an enthusiastic manner.

The London Standard says the disorganization in American securities there yesterday amounted almost to a panic. The News says the fall in American stocks may produce temporary troubles, but can hardly cause, as yet a serious crash.

Appeal's Jackson, Mississippi special: A short session of the legislature which meets on Tuesday, is generally predicted. In regard to the senatorship there is but one opinion, that is, Lamar will be re-elected without opposition from any democrat.

The closing exercises of the Cotton Exposition, at Atlanta, were of the most imposing character, and the programme was carried out with the greatest enthusiasm. The closing address of Kimball, director general, was a very eloquent effort, and received unbounded applause.

The dead body of a young woman, clad only in her night clothes, was discovered this morning floating in the Detroit river, which proved to be Martha Heale, a resident of that city. She was about twenty-five years old and much respected. She had been teaching school for several years past.

At Springfield, Mo., during a quarrel between two little children, named Williams and Gates, aged seven and five years respectively, the younger of the two seized a revolver belonging to one of the older members of the family, and discharged the weapon at his little adversary, killing him instantly.

Democrats met in caucus to-night at Albany, and nominated officers of the Legislature. After adjournment Tammany expressed a determination to oppose their election. No organization expected this week. The candidacy of Senator Jacobs, for President of the Senate, must be withdrawn before Tammany will enter the caucus.
