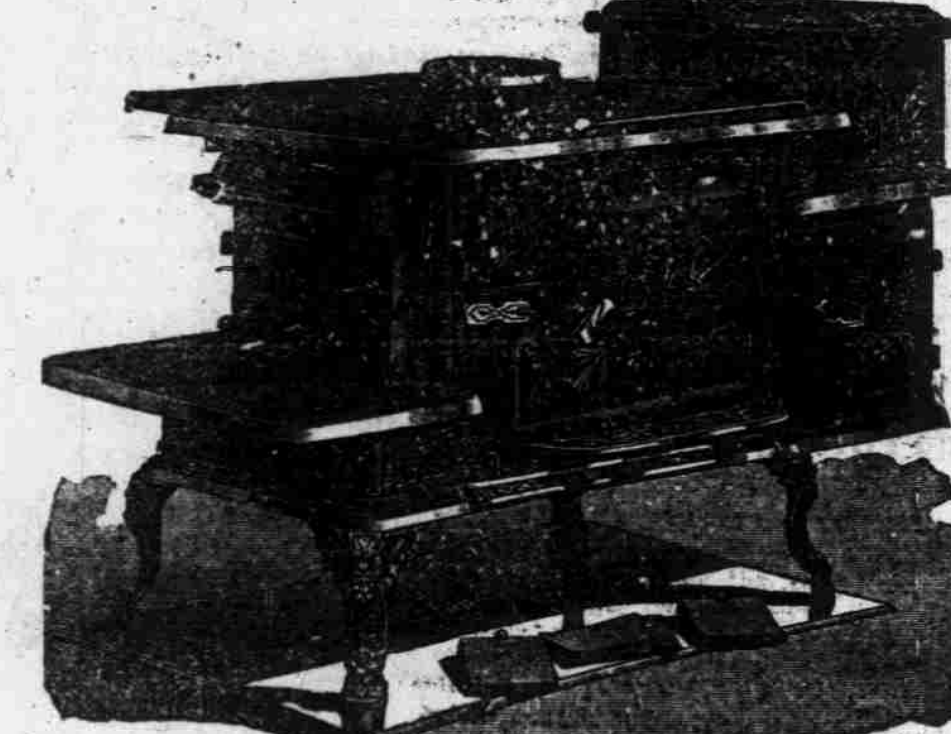

LINCOLN'S LEG CASES.

HOW THE PRESIDENT SUCCEEDED IN

THE LIVES OF MISGUIDED

SOLDIERS.

No man clothed with such vast power

as President Lincoln ever wielded

more tenderly and more effectively

than in his hands the keys of

life and death ever pardoned so

many offenders and so many

instances of cowardice in the army in

the face of the enemy, and the most

punishable by the laws of war brought

into the world, with death, in the

earlier years of the war, all the

penalty of court-martial had been

sent to the president, as commander

in-chief, for pardon, and the most

bold, the judge-advocate-general of

the army, laid the first case before

the president and explained it, he

said, "I will keep this a few days

until I have time to read the

testimony." That seemed quite

reasonable, and the president

said, "I must put this case

until I can settle in my mind

whether this soldier can better

serve the country dead than living."

To the third he answered: "The

general commanding the brigade is

in a few days to consult with

Stanton and myself about military

matters, and I will wait until then

and talk the matter over with
