SESSION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Will Investigate Status of Franchise of the Salt Lake & Ogden Railway Co.

AFFAIRS OF WEBER COUNTY.

Obstructions on Ogden Canyon Roadway Must be Removed—District Court Business—News Briefs.

Ogden, March 18.—At the meeting of the city council last evening the law committee and the city engineer were instructed to investigate whether the Salt Lake & Ogden railway company had lived up to the conditions of the franchise granted to it some months ago.

It was recommended by the law committee that the franchise granted to the Salt Lake & Ogden railway company, giving them the right to maintain rubbish boxes on the street corners for advertising purposes, be revoked. This action was taken on account of the failure of Davidson and Kuchler to pay the rent agreed on. There is now due \$150. The report was adopted and the franchise declared forfeited.

WEBER COUNTY AFFAIRS.

Roadway Obstructions in Ogden Canyon Must be Removed.

Ogden, March 18.—The board of county commissioners held a short session yesterday, transacting a small amount of business.

Commissioner McKay reported that those who have buildings and other obstructions on the county's right of way through Ogden canyon, have not complied with the request of the board to remove the same. The matter was referred to County Attorney Harris, who will commence suit against the owners of the obstructions unless they remove the same.

The terrible conditions of the county roads in most of the districts was brought to the attention of the board.

DISTRICT COURT BUSINESS.

Criminal Cases Heard by Judge Howell—\$150 Fine for Assault.

Ogden, March 18.—Judge Howell had for consideration in the district court a number of criminal matters yesterday. The first to be disposed of was Gust Demas, the Italian laborer who was found guilty by a jury last week of assault, he having shot Wm. E. Emmerson in the arm New Year's morning. A punishment of 150 days in the county jail or a fine of \$150 was imposed. He paid the fine and was released from the county jail where he has been confined during the past 75 days.

To the charge of burglary in the first degree John Brotherton entered a plea of guilty and will be sentenced to the state prison Thursday. He is one of the gang of young toughs who committed various crimes a few weeks ago.

John Crobbie, another of the gang, was arraigned on the charge of robbery, that of holding up a Chinaman to which he entered a plea of not guilty.

Hiram Mosher pleaded not guilty to the charge of polygamy, but the prosecuting attorney has little doubt of being able to prove the charge against him.
