# WEST COMPANY IS HELD RESPONSIBLE

Coroner's Jury Says Criminal Negligence Was Cause Of Higgins' Death.

TENANTS WERE NOT WARNED

Deceased Had a Half Holiday and Returned to His Apartments Where He Met Death.

The coroner's jury impanelled to investigate the death of Corydon W. Higgins, who was found dead in his apartments at the Oxford flats Tuesday, returned a verdict yesterday finding that death had been due to the inhalation of a poisonous gas used in the furnigation of the rooms, and the criminal negligence of the West Dis-infecting company, through its agent,

A M. Rice. The inquest was held by Acting Coroner Stanley A. Hanks, the jury being composed of William Edwards, H. D. Watson and Edward Pickering. The witnesses examined were A. M. Rice, Dr. C. F. Wilcox, John Kamplain, janitor of the Oxford apartments; Louis Sampson, owner of the flats, and Mrs. M. A. Anderson, who occupies the apartments adjoining those in which Mr. Higgins met his death.

In his testimony Mr. Rice said that in the fumigation of the apartments he had used a fumigator known as hydroevanic gas. He stated that he had cyanic gas. He stated that he had warned Mrs. Higgins in the morning not to enter the apartments until he returned in the afternoon, informing her of the poisonous nature of the fumigator, and that he had locked the doors. He said, however, that he had given no further warning nor posted any notice of warning. Although he had used the gas for the purpose of fumigation for the past six years, this had been the

first fatality. Dr. Wilcox, who was called immediately after the body had been found, testified as to the effects of the gas, saying that its fumes would cause an instant and almost painless death. Hydrocyanic gas has but a slight odor.

NO WARNING GIVEN. John Kamplain testified as to the finding of the body and also to the fact that no warning signs had been posted. Louis Sampson, owner, also testified that although he had been informed by Mr. Rice of the poisonous nature of the disinfectant, no warning had been giv-on to the residents in the building. Mrs. M. A. Anderson testified to hav-ng seen the decedent going to the

ipartments. The coroner's jury visited the apartments and also viewed the body at the undertaking parlors. It was learned that Mr. Higgins had a pass key to the apartments, and that on the day of his death he had had a half-holiday, intending to use it in preparing for the removal of himself and wife to the new apartments.

COMPLAINT MAY BE ISSUED. In view of the verdict finding crim-inal negligence on the part of the agent of the West Disinfecting company it is expected that a complaint will be is-sued against Mr. Rice, but County Atty. Lyon stated this forenoon that no application for such had yet been made

The funeral of Mr. Higgins will be held tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock from the residence of his father-in-law, T. Atkins, 335 west Third North street, and interment will be in Mt. Olivet cemetery. The immediate friends of the family are invited to attend the services.

# NEW INSURANCE LAW.

Commissioner Squires Directs Attention to Some of Its Provisions.

Col. George B. Squires, state commissioner of insurance, is sending out circular letters to life insurance companies calling attention to some sections in the law which will become operative after the first of the year. One of these is section 40 of the insurance code pro-viding that no policy of life insurance shall be issued or delivered in this state until the form has been approved by the state commissioner. Another is section 35 providing that the rate of interest assessed in ruling life policies shall be at 31/2 per cent instead of 4 per cent.


