PRESIDENT GEORGE Q. CANNON was the first speaker to address the Conference, and the second of the eighteenth series of the Disciples and Presidents. He relates to the Disciples the history of the Church, its external character; also the ordinances of the Gospel, through which Jesus Christ has manifested his love to the world; the withdrawal of the Higher Priesthood from those in the wilderness; the power of the Spirit rejected; also many other events, including the vision, including the restoration of the Priesthood in our day.

President C. W. Chapman, who had been called to the pulpit, related to the audience the character of the restoration that had been given during the dispensation of the prophets, and the spirit of the vision of the prophet John. The Lord was working with his people, and the saints were to be the instruments here, as in ancient times.

Similar experiences had existed among the people under conditions of trial and tribulation, and the restoration given through the Prophet Joseph Smith in February, 1844, is no less remarkable than the restoration of the priesthood in our day.

President C. W. Chapman, and many others, stated that one of the reasons for the Lord's permitting such a dispersion of the Saints, was that the Saints should be scattered among the nations, and that the world should be witness to their faith.
