The financial situation during the past week has been very good, with the demand for money strong. There are a number of new enterprises in prospect, electric light projects, irrigation canals and kindred propositions, and non-resident promoters have been visiting this city to feel the financial pulse to ascertain what opportunities there may be to obtain money for these purposes. So far as has been learned, all these projects appear meritorious, with nothing at present to dampen expectations of any one regarding the business situation for the coming season. In fact, everything now looks healthful and encouraging. However, this language will have to be modified if applied to conditions outside of Utah, especially in the east, as matters are quiet there. There is a slight improvement from day to day, though the growth is not as rapid as was expected. But in the estimation of conservative men, it is as rapid as might be to have a healthful effect.

**THE CLEWS LETTER.**

Bunny Clews, in his last circular, says: Money is easy everywhere. Not only in New York, but in Paris, Frankfurt and Berlin the tendency of interest rates is still downwards. This, of course, is mainly due to the depression prevailing in commerce and industry in all parts of the world. As a result capital is accumulating and cheaply seeking every form of safe and profitable employment. The effect of this situation upon the security market is marked. In the first place, it causes a good demand for high grade investments from conservative investors and institutions, who have regard for preservation of principal and either dividends or speculative profits. At the same time another class of buyers, viz., the general public, continues to abstain from the market, partly because the dullness of business and diminution of profits damps their purchasing ability, and partly because they naturally tend to look for average stocks are much too high in view of existing conditions. The holders and big market leaders have successfully realized any important decisions thus far, owing to the abundance of cheap money. There are reasons for believing, however, that these same policy it was to support the market and maintain natural tendencies has accumulated all, if not more than the stocks they desire, and that in the absence of buyers their position is anything but a satisfactory one, notwithstanding their unquestioned financial strength.

**REAL ESTATE.**

The local real estate market does not seem to have maintained any startling rise in consequence of what the friends of the nation are pleased to regard as "debate" for prohibition, but rather a quiet fall. It is usually in the time of year, in reality, local conditions do not seem to affect the way or the other. John J. Daly is going ahead with his new building enterprise and has just placed a \$75,000 mortgage in relief funds for the mortgagee, James T. Keith is buying lots on the block west of Holy Cross hospital to open a new street and build a hotel, and is planning to build a new system of improving the street railway system and to push the new car line. Col. Newhouse is still buying up the completion of his new skyscraper, and is planning to build a new banking room there the most elegant in the entire west. The new meter at Garfield is "a go" and orders have been placed for 5,000 more.
