Marblehead, Mass., Sept. 2.-PTo promote good feeling between the German and | First Game-American people, to increase the interest in the international racing and to enable yachtmon of moderate means in the sport are the objects which the Eastern Yacht club of Boston and the German emperor hope to obtain by the series of races which will begin tomorrow in Massachusetts bay between six small yachts representing the two countries.

The incentive is a massive sliver bowl for which President Roosevell stands as sponsor and which is offered by the Eastsponsor and which is offered by the East-ern Yacht club. Next year it is believed that Emperor William will be the dohor of the trophy when the races are sailed at kiel. The German aspirants or chal-lengers are the Glueskauf IV. owned by Gustav Stinnes of Muentheim, represent-ing the Imperial Yacht club of kiel; the Tilly I. owned by Messrs. Doitinan and Krogmann of Hamburg and representing the North German Racing union, and the Wannace, representing the Wannace Sail-ing club and owned by that organiza-tion.

THE AMERICAN BOATS.

The AMERICAN BOATS. The American seekers for, or as they are regarded here, the defenders of the trophy, dre the Auk owned by Charles Francis Adams of the Quincy Yacht club, the Caramba, owned by C. H. Foster of the Eastern Yacht club, and the Vim, owned by Commodore Trenor Liverpool, of the American club of New York. All six yachts are the pick of two big fleets on either side of the ocean. At least five races will be sailed and the Roosevelt cup will go to the owner of the yacht who first wins three races or wins the fifth race of the series. In prin-cipal it is different from any other match ever held in one vital respect, namely. The competing boats are built and the races sailed under the rules of the visit-ine club. ing club.

#### ADVANTAGE FOR GERMANS.

This gives the visitors an advantage This gives the visitors an advantage that will go a long way toward com-pensating for any handicap that they may suffer from racing on strange waters in a strange country. Again the type of boats is a familiar one in Germany, but an entirely new one to the American designers and the outcome will be watched with great interest to see wheth-er the Yankee designer, and builder with-out previous trial has turned out a boat which is faster than his German competi-tor.
