TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.
 Mining Rivers.
 St. Paul, April 11.—The East Claire and Calappa rivers are still rising. About 100,000 feet of lumber, worth \$100,000, the property of the Mississippi Logging Company was swept away by a drift log on the afternoon of the 10th. The river rose higher than it was ever known before, half a day's drift logs being taken over the river. The lumber was taken over the Milwaukee Railroad since Thursday, because several miles of track are under water in the river. It will take ten days to get the lumber. The drift logs are still in the villages inundated and there is much distress at some points.
