

RESULTS OF SUBSOIL FLOWING.

As Reported to the United States Department of Agriculture.

The following letter, giving the results of experiments with subsoil flowing, was recently received by the secretary of agriculture from Mr. Peter Young, Jr., of Geneva, N.Y., and is deemed of sufficient interest to warrant its publication in the agricultural press. Mr. Young writes as follows:

Having previously obtained satisfactory results, one hundred pounds of clover in growing fruit, and enormous crops with growing roots, we concluded to experiment with grain and vegetables. The ground was prepared by subsoil flowing in the fall of 1892, and the crop of 1893 consisted of corn and potatoes. Crops that were only a very few inches deep in the soil, and the average not exceeding 25 bushels per acre, were now yielding 75 bushels per acre from a crop of ground that had been subsoiled. The potato crop was practically a failure in this vicinity. The result of our experiment was a good crop—about 150 bushels per acre.

This season (1894) the crop consisted of corn, clover and potatoes. The corn harvested in the fall of 1893 was 75 bushels per acre, while in the fall of 1894 it was 150 bushels per acre. The potatoes were also a success. The ground was prepared by subsoil flowing in the fall of 1892, and the crop of 1893 consisted of corn and potatoes.
